HAVE you ever heard it said, that to confer a benefit on a man is to make an enemy of him? Thackeray wonders if the traveler who was aided by the good Samaritan ever thanked him; Emerson too once said: "The hand that feeds us is in danger of being bitten." This rather cynical attitude toward human nature is due to the fact that it is hard to receive graciously and hard to give graciously.

Receiving is hard, particularly if we are the proud poor. It seems to make us lose our independence and thus induces some to take revenge on the giver. Sometimes giving can be ungracious particularly when it is done begrudgingly, with condescension or with dark and sinister intentions. We want to tell you that we have no worries on this score because you give in the name of Our Lord and we receive in the name of Our Lord. Thanks to our faith, we see that nothing that we have is ours except the spirit in which we give or the spirit in which we receive. All transactions of giving and receiving are nothing; rather it is the manner in which the act reflects the motive which lies behind it.

We are not humbled in receiving because under the glove that touches your gift is the hand of the Holy Father who receives it for the missions; nor are we proud in giving your gifts to him, because if it were not for your sacrifices we would have nothing to give. We are poor Irish, but not proud. We are poorer missionaries, but grateful in the name of Our Lord and His Blessed Mother.
