**What The Doctor Ordered**

This column, in spite of its personal nature, tries not to "tell tales out of school." Sometimes, though, when a matter is serious enough, and so that others might benefit, we do break precedent. Take the matter of teen-age dieting. . . . Let's start with a personal confession. One generation ago, this writer tried every trick in the book, finally ending with the only successful way to lose weight: inflexible exercise of firmly pushing away from the table.

Before that, though, I had enrolled in a punch-and-pound system that decreased nothing but my pocketbook. . . . My "magic" pills did the same and might have contained goodness only knows what had tried freak diets in college—prepared upstairs in the dormitory while, all the time, Dad was paying for the good, substantial meals served in the dining room at Trinity. Looking back on that period, I recall that my mother didn't know about all the experimentation—it never occurred to me to tell her—though all the other girls knew and most of them were doing the same thing. Hence, it came about as not too much of a surprise that history was repeating itself. The difference is that, nowadays, "quick tricks," "miraculous methods" and "this-is-it" hokum are multiplied many times.

OH, WE KNEW that dieting was going on—one could hardly be chief cook without realizing this—but we didn't know about the extra-curricular activities connected therewith until . . . The doorbell rang and the head pharmacist of a local drug store introduced himself, saying there had been a mix-up in prescriptions. Would we show him the latest medicine purchased by one of us? But our "diet kitchen" will, we hope, result in sane and sensible weight reduction for those who need it in ample supply of the protective foods for all . . . and still some of those "fatties' delights" occasionally.

If this expose stops any of the dangerous "prescription trading" and all the rest, it will have been worth this public tale-bearing. So say we all of us.
