

The following article discusses the Catholic position on Church Unity and also the history, objectives and present status of the Ecumenical Movement among non-Catholic religious groups. The author, Monsignor Hawks, who became a convert from Anglicanism in 1908, is an authority on non-Catholic efforts towards unity both among themselves and in relation to the Catholic Church.

The second so-called Ecumenical Congress is to be held this summer in Evanston, a suburb of Chicago.

The name is improper, since it is applied to a meeting composed almost entirely of Protestants who have not been able to demonstrate any principle of objective unity.
