Why Catholics Remain Aloof From World Council Of Churches

London — (NC) — Why does the Catholic Church stand aloof from the second general assembly of the World Council of Churches which is scheduled to open on August 14 at Evanston, Ill?
THIS QUESTION was answered here by Father Gordon H. Albion, noted Biblical scholar, historian and author, in a national radio address, in which he stressed that the international organization made up of 161 non-Catholic churches in 48 countries can never achieve its fundamental aim of Christian unity.
"Our absence from Evanston is not explained by disinterest in the aims of Evanston—God forbid—but by the fact that the Catholic Church is convinced that unity with Christ is reached only by the authority of Christ," he said.
"The Catholic Church could not attend Evanston except to speak with an authority which the World Council does not even claim for itself and which none of its members would accept," Father Albion was discussing.

Fatima - Area Boy Claims Apparition

Lisbon — (NC) — An 11-year-old boy has experienced an apparition of the Blessed Virgin, a Lisbon newspaper, Diario Popular, reports.
Hundreds of country people in the neighborhood of Asselceira, a remote village near Rio Maior, half way between Fatima and Lisbon, accompanied the boy, Carlos Alberto Silva Delgado, who went, as he said, to keep an appointment with Our Lady.
The boy claims that he and two school fellows were in the habit of going into the fields to pray for success in their school examinations.
They chose the fields, Carlos said, to hide their piety from the ridicule of their playmates. It was on such an occasion that "a beautiful lady" appeared to them and enjoined them to pray for the observance of the Ten Commandments.
Because of the growing attention given to the alleged apparition, the boy has been under the scrutiny of local doctors. Church authorities are very reticent.

Plans Made To Restore Holy Sepulchre Basilica

Jerusalem — (NC) — A series of sweeping changes will be made in the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre here as a result of joint decisions arrived at by representatives of various Greek Catholic chapel occupying the eastern nave will be removed.
The "edicule" or small shrine, over the actual tomb of Christ will be removed, provided that all the religious bodies concerned sign an agreement to this effect.
A new "edicule," or chapel, will be erected over the sepulchre. This is considered an important move because the sepulchral rock was last uncovered in 1555 although the present, collapsing edicule, considered by many to be "unartistic" dates back only to 1810, when it was built by the Russian and Greek Orthodox following a destructive fire.
The sagging facade of the basilica will be demolished and rebuilt as far as possible with the same stones.
EACH RELIGIOUS community with rights in the basilica—the Catholics, Greek Orthodox and Armenian dissidents—must have a technical staff to supervise and care for their respective holy places within the basilica. These three technical staffs jointly form the office in charge of all technical work.
According to arrangements dating back to the time when the Holy Land was in Moslem hands, no repairs may be carried out except by the consent of all three groups who hold services there. Each group would be expected to contribute toward the cost of repairs or reconstruction. This creates a dilemma for the Orthodox, who are reportedly too impoverished to pay their share and yet—according to reports—are highly reluctant to see the Catholics getting credit for paying the whole bill.

Restored Hearing Held Attributable To St. Anne

Quebec — (NC) — Edward Reilly of Detroit, Mich., attributes the cure of his deafness to a pilgrimage to the Basilica of St. Anne de Beaupre.
An accident in a wartime industry plant left Mr. Reilly almost totally deaf in 1945. Treatments to restore his hearing were unsuccessful.
Last month he accompanied his crippled wife to the Shrine to pray for her cure. He had no thought of praying for relief of his own affliction. He followed all the Shrine devotions with his wife. One evening after Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, he went to the altar to venerate the relic of St. Anne.
When the priest touched his head lightly with the relic, he said, he felt as if his head would burst. Then suddenly he noticed that his 10-year-old deafness was completely gone.
Although Church authorities have made no official comment on the cure, Mr. Reilly and many of his associates look upon the occurrence as more than a natural phenomenon.

Youngest Cistercian Abbot Installed

Dubuque, Ia. — (RNS) — The Rt. Rev. Dom Philip O'Connor, O.C.S.O., was solemnly blessed and formally installed as seventh abbot of Our Lady of New Melroy Cistercian Abbey at a Solemn Pontifical Mass in the abbey chapel here.
Thirty-eight years old, Abbot O'Connor is the youngest abbot in the 105-year history of New Melroy and one of the youngest in the entire Cistercian Order. He succeeds the Rt. Rev. Dom Vincent J. Daly, O.C.S.O., 43, who died on May 16.

Sees 200 Stations

Bp. Sheen Doubts TV Program Cuts

New York — (NC) — Bishop Fulton J. Sheen predicted he will return to television this fall with more stations than ever before despite announcements by the programs' sponsor that the number will be drastically cut.
Interviewed here, the Bishop said he could express only disbelief that the Admiral Corporation, sponsor of his record-breaking weekly TV talks, "Life Is Worth Living," will carry out its plan to deprive 140 stations of kinescope recordings of the telecasts.
Two days after Admiral said it would slash the Bishop's TV audience by over 40 per cent, letters began pouring in to the prelate's New York offices.
"I am sure that when we return to the air in November we will be on more stations than ever before—close to 200," Bishop Sheen said.
Reaching a total of 169 stations last season the prelate broke all U. S. television records. His television talks which started "live" on three stations in February, 1952, grew at a phenomenal rate, gained the plaudits of TV critics and audiences, and won sponsorship fees which the Bishop turns over to suffering people of all races and creeds throughout the world.
"I DO NOT believe that the Admiral Corporation which has sponsored a program which gives moral integrity to its products would alienate the good will of listeners on 103 stations through the nation," Bishop Sheen said.
Admiral announced last week that it will end all kinescope broadcasts of the Bishop's show, stating that the film records gave a poor quality picture. Spokesmen said the program will be available to stations only on a "live" (direct) basis.
Referring to the "alleged reason" for Admiral's action, Bishop Sheen selected a sample letter from a stack piled on his desk from viewers of the program. It read: "We don't mind kinescopes. But we can't do without you." Other letters said the kinescopes were clear; some viewers said they couldn't tell the difference between kinescope and live broadcasts.
Some of the mail held the

thousands of viewers that the decision was not his.
Referring to the Admiral announcement, Bishop Sheen said: "I disbelieve my eyes. I don't believe they will do it." The Kinescope recordings which Admiral has said it will now drop, figured largely in the program's precedent-setting rise. Astounding TV experts who saw little drawing power in lectures on philosophy, love, and morality, "Life Is Worth Living," immediately earned a new popularity, competing with the Milton Berle show.
