

GOD LOVE YOU!

LAST year 70% of all the financial help the Holy Father distributed to the missionary world came from the United States. Actually the amount was not great for it amounted to only 25c per Catholic man, woman and child—in other words we gave to the Holy Father for his 100,000 missionaries, 50,000 schools, 220 leproasaria, 3,500 dispensaries, 220 homes for the aged, 1,500 orphanages, 1,300 hospitals, the equivalent of one package of cigarettes.

This average of 25c is not due to a want of generosity on the part of the American Catholic. It is due rather to a want of consciousness of the duty of the Catholic to spread his faith through the world. It is like meeting a poor person. No help is given not because one is greedy or tight or avaricious, but because one's faith is not deep enough to see Christ in that poor person. Those who do not give in Christ's name see only the poor person and ask "is he deserving?" So it is with the pagan world, the hungry, the lepers, the sick. There is not a single Catholic in the U.S. who would not sacrifice at least a dollar for them and thus share in the 15,000 Masses said annually for those who aid the Holy Fathers Missions.

The problem is to get every Catholic to see that every hungry person in India, every suffering soul in Nigeria, every persecuted missionary in China is Christ, hungry, suffering, and crucified. Our Lord said: "I was hungry and you gave Me to eat." The claims of the pagan world are not a test of your generosity. They are a test of your faith. What is your reaction?

Day Camp Nears Close At Genesee Settlement House

Camp Fisher, day camp of the Genesee Settlement House, is nearing the completion of another summer of activities for boys and girls aged four to 12. The camp, which this year had 207 boys and girls enrolled, will conclude on Aug. 13. A staff of 32 counselors have directed their activities since the opening on July 6.

Children in the four to six year old group are under the supervision of Miss Marion Fadulano who has on her staff Miss Estelle D'Agostino as senior counselor, Miss Arloa Kennedy as junior counselor and Miss Mary Louise Hart as a volunteer.

The group has been taking swimming lessons under the supervision of the Charlotte Beach life guards and every child in the "baby" group has learned to do the face float and overcome any fear he might have had of the water. This group spends each Friday at the Settlement House doing craft and having a restful day away from the crowded beach.

The six to eight year old children have five groups each group made up of children in approximately the same age range. Supervising this group is Miss Rita Contestable who is a full time staff member of the Settlement House. Under Miss Contestable's supervision are the following senior counselors each in charge of one of the in between age groups. Mrs. Robert Santangelo, Miss Theresa Ciralco, Miss Virginia Keegan, Miss Winifred Dean and Miss Mary LaMonica. Assisting the senior counselors are the following junior counselors: Miss Annette Caterino, Miss Jean Barber, Miss Phyllis Eaton, Miss Rose D'Ortona, and Miss Carol Moore. Program in the six to eight year old groups centers around the use of the city parks and beaches.

Campers are receiving swim instructions twice weekly at Charlotte Beach; Durand Eastman Park is used weekly and allows for much nature study and for the ever popular "cook out" where the children cook hot and other good things to eat. Special trip for the six to eight year olds was held Wednesday, Aug. 4 when they went to Hamlin Beach Park for the day.

Nine year olds are always anxious to start with canteens and other camping equipment—it is only when you are nine that you are allowed this equipment in Day Camp Fisher. Four groups of nine year olds have been building camp skills such as fire building, how to handle themselves in the water, how to cook more than one food at a time on an out door fire.

Supervisor of the group is Miss Ann Stehle, group work director, at the Settlement House. Acting as Counselors with the nine are: Miss Jean Alaimo, Miss Robert Zaenglein and Ernest Kurts. Overnight Camp is the highlight for all the Campers—aged nine to 12 but especially does it appeal to the 10 to 12 year old boys and girls.
