

St. Louis Enrollment Outgrows School Capacity

Enrollments in St. Louis Parish grammar school have completely outgrown the institution's capacity since it was opened four years ago according to a statement issued today by the Rev. John Reddington, pastor.

"In our first year," said Father Reddington, "our registration consisted of 68 pupils. In 1951 it climbed to 160. In 1952 it went to 172. In 1953, it reached 212, while for the school year starting with next September, it has soared to 240."

"This represents more than absolute capacity for our present school... for, during the coming scholastic year it will be necessary for us to care for 20 kindergarten children in the parish school."

"These figures," Father Reddington added, "represent an increase of over 400% in four years' time. Our records show that there are about 310 Catholic children of grammar-school age residing in the parish right now, while past history indicates that each succeeding year will add from 10 to 15% more."

TO HELP alleviate this condition—and in anticipation of the future educational needs of the parish—plans are currently under way to launch a drive to raise funds for a new 8-room grammar school as well as a new church, both to be erected on parish property at 52 S. Main Street, Pittsford.
