Daniel J. Meagher Funeral Rites Held At Cathedral

Funeral services were held on Tuesday, Aug. 10, 1954 for Daniel J. Meagher from Farrell Brothers Colonial Funeral Home and Sacred Heart Cathedral.
The Rev. Francis J. Taylor celebrated the Solemn Requiem Mass, with the Rev. Leo A. Jones as deacon and the Rev. Vincent E. Le Frois, subdeacon.
His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey was present in the sanctuary with the Rev. Donald E. Lux.
Mr. Meagher, who for 20 years managed the boys' clothing department at the National Clothing Co., died on Aug. 7, 1954 in St. Mary's Hospital after an illness of 1 1/2 years. He was 71.

BORN IN Belleville, Ont. Mr. Meagher was educated in schools in the community and in Cambellford, Ont. He served his apprenticeship as a clothing buyer in stores in two Canadian communities.

In 1913, Mr. Meagher moved his family to Rochester where he accepted a position as boys' clothing buyer with Sibley, Lindsay and Curr Co. From Sibley's he went directly to the National. His home was at 397 Raines Park.
Mr. Meagher was a member of the Holy Name Society and the Men's Club of Sacred Heart Cathedral.
HE IS SURVIVED by his widow, Mrs. Johanna Convey Meagher; four sons, Paul J., Thomas F., Daniel R. and John L.; two daughters, Mrs. Thomas H. Ferguson and Mrs. John P. Kearney; five sisters, Mrs. William H. Coveney, Mrs. William J. Fenlon, Mrs. James Larkin, Mrs. Hugh J. Neary and Mrs. Thomas E. Murphy; 20 grandchildren, numerous nieces and nephews, all of Rochester.
Interment was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery with Father Taylor officiating, assisted by Fathers Jones and Le Frois.



