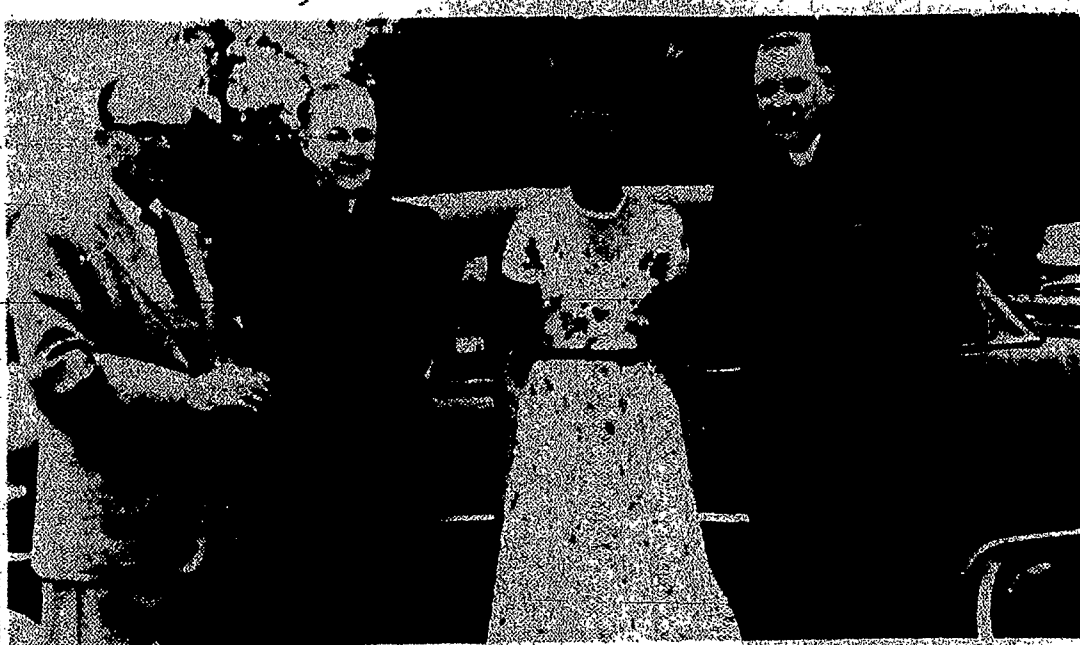

BORN IN Belleville, Ont. Mr. Meagher was educated in schools in the community and in Cambridge, Ont. He served his apprenticeship as a clothing buyer in stores in two Canadian communities.

In 1913, Mr. Meagher moved his family to Rochester where he accepted a position as boys' clothing buyer with Sibley, Lindsay and Cur Co. From Sibley's he went directly to the National. His home was at 397 Raines Park.

Mr. Meagher was a member of the Holy Name Society and the Men's Club of Sacred Heart Cathedral.

HE IS SURVIVED by his widow, Mrs. Johanna Convey Meagher; four sons, Paul J., Thomas F., Daniel R., and John L.; two daughters, Mrs. Thomas H. Ferguson and Mrs. John P. Kearney; five sisters, Mrs. William H. Coveney, Mrs. William J. Fenlon, Mrs. James Larkin, Mrs. Hugh J. Neary and Mrs. Thomas E. Murphy; 20 grandchildren, numerous nieces and nephews, all of Rochester.
