**Reunion Day Set Saturday At Girls' Camp At Lake**

Reunion Day at Camp MADONNA, the Catholic Women's Club camp for girls on Canandaigua Lake, will be held Saturday, August 14. Campers of each camping period during the summer will return with their parents and friends for this annual event.

The program this year will begin at 2:30 p.m. with a water pageant, followed by a presentation of "Hansel and Gretel" out of doors by the current group of campers. After a picnic supper brought by the parents, a father-and-daughter baseball game will take place.

Camp Madonna occupies 7 1/2 acres with 700 feet of waterfront on the west side of Canandaigua Lake. Leary, Chaplain, goes each Sunday to say Mass at an improvised altar on the lawn—not only for these campers, but for campers who come over from nearby Camp Oranica, and for neighborhood cottagers.

The great yearly pilgrimage of the sick and afflicted to the Shrine of St. Anne de Beauport, Province of Quebec, Canada, will take place this year, on Sunday, Aug. 22. On that day, the little village of Ste. Anne de Beauport is expected to be stormed by more than 50,000 pilgrims, who will take part in the public prayers and ceremonies that will be conducted at the Miraculous Canadian Shrine on behalf of the sick and afflicted.

Service hours at Ste. Anne de Beauport on Aug. 22 are: 9:30 a.m., St. Ann's High Mass for the sick and invalid; 10:30 a.m., Rosary for the sick, outside in front of Basilica; 2:30 p.m., Rosary for the sick, outside, in front of Basilica; 3 p.m., Procession of the Blessed Sacrament and Blessing of the sick, in the Church Park, in front of Basilica; with Veneration of the relics of St. Anne.

Besides these special devotions on behalf of the sick and afflicted, Masses (with Holy Communion) will be said from 5:30 a.m. until noon; and at 8:00 p.m., a candle light procession will take place with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and Veneration of St. Anne's Relics.
