

Newly Formed Religious Order To Train At Abbey

The first American group of the Little Brothers of Jesus, a religious congregation founded in France in 1893, will begin a period of training on Aug. 15 at the Cistercian Abbey of Our Lady of the Genesee, Pittsford.

Following the six-week program, applicants accepted will leave for Africa where they will begin their novitiate in the Sahara desert.

THE REV. CHARLES SALA has arrived here from Europe to direct the postulancy. This period of religious instruction and training in the vocation of a Little Brother of Jesus is taking place in the Pittsford Monastery

because the French community has no motherhouse in this country. During this time of extended retreat, they will be guests of the Abbot, Gerard McGinley, and monks of Our Lady of the Genesee.

The Little Brothers were founded according to a rule outlined by Father Charles de Foucauld, who was martyred in the desert in 1916. The Little Brothers have been recognized officially as a congregation since 1936.

Sister Josephine Arcangeli Dies In Newark, N. J.

Sister Josephine Arcangeli, M.P.F., daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Arcangeli of Watkins Glen, died Saturday, July 31, 1954 at St. Michael's Hospital, Newark, N. J. after a prolonged illness. She was 31.

A Solemn Requiem Mass was offered on Aug. 2 in the Villa Walsh Chapel, Morristown, N. J., with His Excellency Archbishop Thomas A. Boland presiding. The Mass was offered by the Rev. Pasquale Schmitz, S.A.C. The Rev. John Neilligan of Scotch Plains, N. J. was deacon and the Rev. Benedict Ehrmann of Watkins Glen, subdeacon.

Also in the sanctuary were the Reverend Fathers Joseph Ferrecchia, O.M.I. who acted as master of ceremonies, William Furlong of Seton Hall, Father Anselmi, O.S.B., and several other priests from different parishes.

Her life as a Religious Teacher began on Aug. 19, 1897 at Villa Walsh and she was invested on June 16, 1939. She made her perpetual obligation on Aug. 23, 1942.

YEARS OF PAINFUL illness could not prevent Sister Josephine from performing her duties as an educator. Her great love for mankind manifested itself to the very end when she expressed her desire to live because there was so much work to be done in furthering the cause of Christ.

Sister Josephine taught at St. Francis, Hackensack, N. J.; St. Anne's, New York City; St. Anthony's, Red Bank, N. J. and St. Mary's in New Brunswick, N. J. Her last three years were spent in teaching the fifth grade in St. Bartholomew's in Apostles School, Scotch Plains, N. J. Her untiring efforts and zeal to further the work of Christ won for her the love and respect due to an ardent apostle.

Besides her parents, she is survived by her sisters, Sister Ernestine, M.P.F., superior of St. Joachim's, Trenton, N. J.; Sister Elizabeth, M.P.F., who has been teaching in Hammonville, N. J., and Mrs. Dmitri Kosmena of Philadelphia, Pa.

The eulogy and final blessing were rendered by Archbishop Boland. The body was then taken in solemn procession to the Villa Walsh Cemetery.
