Bishop Foery Announces Syracuse Diocese Plans

Bishop Walter A. Foery, Bishop of Syracuse and a native of Rochester, has announced plans for improvements in the Syracuse Diocese. The plans were released on the occasion of the Bishop's seventeenth anniversary as Bishop, Wednesday, Aug. 18.

A site has already been acquired for a new Chancery on a downtown Syracuse site and also plans have been made for construction of a new wing for Loretto Rest to be known as St. Plus X Hall.

Bishop Foery made known that growth of the Syracuse Diocese has made the present Chancery inadequate and that the new building will house the Chancery, Office of Education, Propagation of the Faith and the Cemetery Offices.

The Syracuse Diocese now has 146 Parishes, 36 Missions, 54 Parochial elementary schools and 17 Catholic High Schools, plus three Catholic private high schools. Two more parochial elementary schools are under construction and four are in the process of planning.

Bishop Foery was ordained to the priesthood from St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, on June 10, 1916. He had been pastor of Holy Rosary and of Our Lady of Mount Carmel parishes in Rochester, and also director of Catholic Charities and the Co-

luminous Civic Center. He was raised to the hierarchy by His Holiness on May 26, 1937, and was consecrated in this office on August 18, 1937. Bishop Foery was formally installed in Syracuse on September 1, 1937.

THE COMING YEAR will see seven new schools dedicated in the Syracuse diocese. In addition there will be a new gymnasium added to Oswego Catholic High School. Five new churches will be dedicated and another will be enlarged. A new chapel is being added to the Channing Protestant School, and four new convents are to be dedicated.

The new wing of St. Elizabeth's Hospital, Utica, is expected to be completed this year and the new administration building at Lourdes Hospital in Binghamton will be ready for dedication.

The closed retreat movement in the Syracuse diocese has grown and the new Stella Maris Retreat House for women at Skaneateles will officially open on Sept. 11. During the present year, the new wing of Christ the King Retreat House for men will be under construction.
