Greek Rite Bishop Observes Triple Jubilee

Philadelphia—Archbishop Constantine Bonachevsky, Bishop of the Ukrainian Greek Rite Diocese of the United States, has observed the 30th anniversary of his arrival in this country. (There are three Ukrainian Greek Rite Churches in the Diocese of Rochester under Archbishop Bonachevsky. They are St. Joseph, Rochester; St. Peter and Paul, Auburn, and St. Nicholas, Elmira Heights. He has visited this area often.) Shortly after his consecration as a Bishop in Rome, Archbishop Bonachevsky arrived in New York on August 14, 1924, and the following day came to Philadelphia to take over the administration of his diocese. During 1954, the Archbishop also celebrated, on June 17, his 70th birthday and, on January 31, the 45th anniversary of his ordination. In commemoration of the Archbishop's triple jubilee, The Way, Ukrainian Catholic weekly newspaper, dedicated its August 15th issue to the prelate.

Father Gefell To Attend Advanced Service School

Fort Jay, Governors Island—Chaplain (Major) Gerard Joseph Gefell, 38, of Rochester, has been selected to attend the Army's Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.

Chaplain Gefell has recently returned to Fort Jay after 60 days' field duty at Camp Drum. CHAPLAIN GEFELL'S parents, August E. and Mary Gefell, of 42 Lill St., have two daughters and seven sons, including two pairs of male twins. Chaplain Gefell's twin brother Joseph, an Army captain, is presently regimental chaplain in the 32nd Infantry Regiment in Korea. Prior to entering the service he was assistant pastor of St. Alphonsus Church in Auburn, and assistant pastor of St. Michael's Church, Newark. In the service, Father Gefell served for two years at Fort Monmouth, N. J., and then for three years in the European Command at Heidelberg. He became Post Chaplain of Fort Jay when he returned from Europe in 1953. "I find rich opportunity in the Army to help others spiritually," says Father Gefell in discussing his decision to become an Army Chaplain. "This is the lifework to which I have dedicated myself. I find serving military personnel very rewarding because of their generous spirit of cooperation." During his six years in the service, Chaplain Gefell estimates he has performed 125 marriages and 300 baptisms.
