

### Daniel C. Malone's Rites Conducted At St. Jerome's

Funeral of Daniel C. Malone of 116 Stoneligh Ct., Pittsford, father of a Sister of St. Joseph, co-founder of the East Rochester Catholic Youth Organization and exemplary Catholic layman, was held yesterday, August 25, at the Ford Funeral Home, 209 West Ave., East Rochester, and in St. Jerome's Church.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rev. Roy B. Morphy assisted by the Rev. John S. Whalen, Deacon; the Rev. T. Paul Murley, Subdeacon and the Rev. Anthony P. Gallmer, master of ceremonies.

Also in the Sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. F. William Stauder, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Louis W. Edelman, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph H. Gefell and the Reverend Fathers William H. Shannon, Edward J. Lintz and Robert A. Meng.

Mr. Malone, 71, who served as a peace justice in East Rochester for 23 years, died August 23, 1954, in St. Mary's Hospital after a month's illness.

ONE OF HIS daughters is Sister Helen Daniel, chairman of the Speech and Drama Department at Nazareth College, Pittsford.

Mr. Malone was active in many Catholic circles. He was a Fourth Degree Knight of Columbus, a trustee of St. Jerome's Church and a member of the church's Holy Name Society and the "Nocturnal Adoration Society. He was also a member of the First Friday Luncheon Club and active in the lay retreat movement. When active in Rochester Council K. of C. he participated in campaigns for erection of the Columbus Civic Center.

He cooperated with the late Rev. Bernard J. Gefell, then pastor of St. Jerome's in East Rochester in 1938 to found the Catholic Youth Organization. It functioned as a youth center for many years and in 1948 became a branch of the Columbus Youth Association, a Community Chest Red Feather Agency.

PEACE JUSTICE Malone and Father Gefell were leaders in the movement to construct a new building for the association which serves as a community center for boys and girls of all faiths.

Justice Malone was supervisor of the air brakes division of Merchants Dispatch in East

Standout rookies with the Eagles are Neil Worden, a bruising fullback from Notre Dame, and Tony Rados, talented quarterback from Penn State.

Lattner and Worden were the touchdown twins on a Notre Dame team which was acclaimed one of the best in the nation last fall. It was the last Irish team to be coached by Frank Leahy, who went on record as saying it was the best team he ever handled.

THERE WAS always the question as to who was the better back between Lattner and Worden. They will be facing each other for the first time Wednesday. And that game may start answering the question.

Joe Each, Steelers' skipper, posted fine coaching records at Duquesne University, Niagara University and at St. Bonaventure and Syracuse before coming to Pittsburgh.

He employs the T-formation as does Jim Trimble, coach of the Eagles. The Philadelphia club has won two world championships in the last seven years.

The Steelers' sharp alternate between a sharp passing and hard running game. Chucking for Pittsburgh will be Jimmy Finks, Bill Mackrides, Maurie Duncan and Stark. Handling the running will be Lattner, Cameron, Fran Rogel, Ray Mathews and Lynn Chand-nols, one of the all-time great backs from Michigan State.

The game promises to be even more of a thriller than last year's inaugural match in which the Baltimore Colts defeated the Steelers, 13-6.

Interment was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, Rochester.
