A Review: Spiritual Revolution Of Franciscanism

 "Social Ideals of St. Francis." Eight Lessons in Applied Christianity. By Fr. James Meyer, O.F.M. St. Louis, Mo., and London.
 Catholicity is a social religion in that it governs the inner and outer man and is for all the people. Social affairs, interchange between peoples, are deeply affected by the governing ethics are mightily moulded by Jesus Christ, the High Priest of all Catholicity. A comprehensive book on the "Social Ideals" of a leader such as St. Francis of Assisi is of great importance because Francis made Christ his sole guide.
 We are aware that we are concerned with a book that came late to our attention. It was published in 1948... but it is wisdom to bring it to the attention of those who would know what St. Francis intended in his Rule of Life of the Third Order Secular. What we began a review may wind up as a brief-condensation.

CHRISTIAN TRUTH can still make us free. Christian truth in practice can turn the tide. Fr. Meyer makes us confident that the regeneration and growth of the members of the Third Order is still the sun of hope in the skies of our time.
 His Holiness Pope Pius XII said to a group of Franciscans in 1943: "The human race seems to trek to an abyss, supported by the sensuality and pride of the world. There is, however, a course of action led by the spirit of Christ that lies in the desire of the members of the Third Order. Society has a great need of this spirit today and only for peace, happiness and prosperity but, in a way, for its very existence."
 Social recovery is not a mass affair but an affair of masses of individuals. He wants us to remember, says Fr. Meyer, that Franciscanism is a way of life. The devoted person can show the general public and the government. Tertulian that the formula of St. Francis loses none of its zest for the leveling of our modern troubles and offers a way out of moral stagnation and corruption meeting the needs of the day.
 Computation is the exact opposite of Francis' ideal of voluntary action. Are we too ambitious in placing the ideal of St. Francis as a destroyer of communism? What can Franciscanism do for the world?
DISPITE THE great extent of materialized education, despite the progress of material inventive genius in our standard of living, today's world is in the last stages of crisis. The situation is bad, politically, at home and abroad and morally, socially and economically. A pessimism of the State hits the possibility of putting the ship of state on an even keel by destroying initiative and thus, in the end, civilization.
 But it is not a part of God's plan that we walk alone. God will not permit His children to play a lone hand; but even if He should seem to do so, it would be a part of duty. Souls, however, are not expendable.
 In the first picture, that of the Thirteenth Century, it was left to St. Francis to institute a special organization to help and encourage those who would keep a lifetime of Christian ideals in return for the hope that these lifetimes of example would affect the farthest, strongest and most inaccessible dictator.

Francis led an army-corp of beggar soldiers under the banner of Christ and with this motley outfit changed the world of his time... a world strangely alike to ours... a world corrupted by wealth-consciousness among the "haves" and corrupted by the lazy, slave-mindedness among those who "have not."
THE BASIS OF THE Rule of Life lies in his profound respect for the dignity of man—both as race and as individuals. He made a way for the masses to enter the religious life in keeping with lay responsibilities of parenthood and citizenship. By popularizing his ideals he wrought in every horse a stumbling block for corruption.

 Archbishop Levanne, 73, was previously Interspuncio to Egypt. He succeeds Archbishop Gerald O'Hara, Bishop of Savannah, Georgia, who recently was named Apostolic Delegate to Great Britain.
