Lima—Opening of St. Rose School of Lima with 170 pupils including 30 from Honeoye Falls and 20 from West Bloomfield on Sept. 8 is announced today by the Very Rev. John M. Ball, V.F., dean of Livingston deanery.

This makes St. Rose School a Catholic Central School, Father Ball said. Public school buses will transport the pupils to Lima from near their homes in the adjoining areas.

The kindergarten will open on Sept. 20 for half-day afternoon sessions. The new feature of the kindergarten is that a lay teacher, Mrs. John Daly, a member of St. Rose parish will be in charge.

Jesuit From Here Going To India


The Rev. Michael F. Kavanagh, S.J., son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Michael Kavanagh, and former pastor of St. Joseph's Church, Morganza, Md. is planning to leave for a missionary assignment in the Jamshedpur area, about 150 miles west of Calcutta, India, this month.

In preparation for his new post, Father Kavanagh took an intensive seven-week course in Hindi, a basic language of India. He took the course at the Georgetown University Institute of Languages and Linguistics with Nanta K. Choudry, a native of India as teacher.

During his pastorate of St. Joseph's in Morganza back in 1950, Father Kavanagh baptized 16 Lumbee Indians who were interested in Catholicism by Chief Turkey of Morganza who boasts that his Catholic lineage goes back to Chief Kitamquinn, "Emperor" of the Piscataway. The "Emperor" was baptized in 1640 by the Rev. Andrew White, S.J., pioneer missionary.

Born in Rochester in 1910, Father Kavanagh attended St. Augustine's School and St. Andrew's Seminary before entering the Society of Jesus. He was ordained at Woodstock-on-the-Hudson in 1941. He has a sister who is a nun and a brother, a priest in Texas. His other sister is Mrs. James E. McMahon, 145 Hobart St.

George Heisel Retires From Police Force

Traffic Inspector George IV. Heisel, 69, first president of the Police Holy Name Society and a charter member of the Nocturnal Adoration Society, will retire from the Rochester police force on Oct. 8 to join his son George S. Heisel, in the operating of the National Ambulance and Oxygen Service Inc.

A member of the force for 48 years, Heisel is formerly of SS. Peter and Paul Parish and is now a member of Good Counsel Parish, Rochester, where he is a member of the Men's Club.

He is also member of the First Friday Luncheon Club, of which his son the Rev. Raymond G. Heisel, assistant pastor of St. Andrew Parish, is moderator. He lives at 67 Rosalind St.

Heisel, who joined the force on March 15, 1908, is the senior member of the Police Bureau in point of service. He has long played a leading role in the city's fight to keep its traffic accident toll at a minimum.

In 1936 Heisel became one of the first policemen to attend the Traffic Officer's Training School at Harvard University.

Two years later he helped organize the Accident Prevention Bureau (now Division). The unit had one auto then, today, with tight cars and radar equipment—it is one of the Police Bureau's most important divisions.

He now heads both the Accident-Prevention Division and the city's traffic squad.

Thirty-one young women including 12 Elmira and four Rochesterians will begin the three-year course in Nursing at St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing, Elmira on Sept. 12. An orientation program is planned.
