### New Aquinas Coach Stresses Conditioning

Stan Zajdel, new head coach at Aquinas Institute, hasn't lost any time in rounding his squad into shape. More than 100 boys met him on Sept. 1 and he has already cut the squad to 46.  
Morning and afternoon sessions have been held, including a two-hour instruction period in the morning, and five hours of drill in the afternoon.  
Zajdel is a stickler for condition. Each drill has consisted of two hours of calisthenics, wind-sprints, laps, etc. For the first three days several players showed signs of exhaustion, but hard work is beginning to bring results. The boys are running faster, blocking harder and are tiring less.  
AQUINAS FANS are crowding the back campus every afternoon, as practices are being run off with precision, a spirit of excitement is among the players. Zajdel's tremendous enthusiasm and his ability to work long hours has become contagious.

Rome—(NC)—The rector of the Catholic University of Louvain, Msgr. Honore Van Weyerburgh, has been named Titular Bishop of Gilva, and Auxiliary to His Eminence Joseph Cardinal Van Roey, Archbishop of Malines.

### Oldest Vincentian Dies At Niagara

Niagara University, N.Y.—Clergy and lay representatives of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and the Diocese of Brooklyn, joined with clergy, laity and civic organizations of the Diocese of Buffalo, in paying tribute to the late Rev. Michael J. Higgins, C.M., former treasurer at Niagara University, at a Solemn Pontifical Mass of Requiem, held Monday in Alumni Chapel on the university campus.

The Most Rev. Joseph A. Burke, D.D., Bishop of the Diocese of Buffalo, celebrated the Mass, assisted by the Rev. Eugene W. Wormer, C.M., as assistant priest. The Very Rev. Francis J. Meade, C.M., president of the university, was deacon and the Rev. William J. Thomas, C.M., was subdeacon.  
Father Higgins, widely known throughout the Eastern United States, was the oldest Vincentian priest in the world at the time of his death. He had celebrated his 89th birthday last March and in May had observed the 60th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood.

Father Higgins who died Sept. 2, 1954 at Mt. St. Mary's Hospital, Niagara Falls, was ordained to the priesthood on May 19, 1864. He served as a professor and as treasurer of St. John's University, Brooklyn, curate at St. Vincent's Church, Germantown, Pa., and as pastor of Immaculate Conception Church, Philadelphia, prior to becoming treasurer at Niagara University in 1934. He had been stationed at Niagara since that time.

A native of New York City, Father Higgins was born March 9, 1861. He attended the parochial schools of that city and St. Vincent's Apostolic School and St. Vincent's seminary both in Germantown, Philadelphia.  
Bishop Burke gave the absolution at the interment, which took place in Our Lady of Angels' cemetery on the university campus.

"The Buffalo Chapter Mistress of Novices has worked out with Father Rosenthal a program of 10 lectures explaining the Third Order, its rule and other helps to growing in the love of God."  
These lectures are compulsory for novices, but many professed members have found them invaluable to their own spiritual growth. A Rochester tertiary went to Buffalo in Sept. 3, with the Mistress of Novices and they were greatly inspired by both the spirit and the content of these talks.
