

General MacArthur Pays Tribute To Area Chaplains

High tribute to the Catholic priests who served under him during the Pacific Campaign in World War II was paid by General Douglas MacArthur at a civic reception tendered him at the Mark Twain Hotel, Elmira, on Sept. 9.

Seated at the speakers' table were Rep. W. Sterling Cole of

Bath, chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, Rev. John S. Hayes, chaplain at the Veterans' Administration in Bath, and Rev. Leslie G. Whalen, vice-chancellor of the Diocese of Rochester.

Father Hayes, Major in the Army Reserve and representing the Veterans' Hospital in Bath delivered the invocation.

THE GENERAL was most affable and in the course of his remarks spoke highly of the work of the Catholic priests in bolstering the morale of the men under his command, and said with pride that they were among his greatest supporters.

Rochester priests who served in the Pacific during the last war were the Reverend Fathers Raymond Hiesel, Elmer Heindel, Darcy Boiger, Leslie Whalen, and Michael O'Brien.

Representing the clergy of the city of Elmira were Rt. Rev. Msgr. William J. Brien of St. Patrick's Church and the Rev. Leo Schwab of Our Lady of Lourdes.


