

3-A Corning Police Slate Smut Publication War

Corning — Police Chief Roman J. Laurence has announced that after an extended time in the planning stage, a movement to block the sale of publications exploiting crime, sex and immorality will get underway in Corning next month.

"When we start," he said, "we are going to do as good a job as is possible within the purview of state laws.

"I want to go into the bills drawn by the joint legislative committee on comic books. It is the intent of two of these bills to give local police and city attorneys greater authority in bringing about enforcement."

HE POINTED out that comic book publishers, meeting recently in Daytona Beach, Fla., announced that they would set up a self-regulatory system under a specially selected head who would censor their publications.

"We are waiting to see how this system works out," Chief Laurence explained. "As yet, it has not reached Corning, but we hope that it will be long."
