Up-To-Date Apostolic Role Stressed For Parishes

Vatican City—(NC)—Pope XII has called upon Catholic parishes to keep up-to-date in their apostolic activities and methods.

The Holy Father's admonition was contained in a letter written in his name by Msgr. Giovanni B. Montini, Vatican Pro-Secretary of State, and addressed to His Eminence Giacomo Cardinal Lercaro, Archbishop of Bologna.

THE OCCASION was the fourth annual Week of Pastoral Orientation in the Bologna archdiocese. During the past two and a half years, Cardinal Lercaro has inaugurated many diverse activities in his strongly Communist-infiltrated See designed to bring Catholic teaching to bear on current social problems.

Monsignor Montini reminded Cardinal Lercaro that Pope Pius XII, from the beginning of his pontificate, has tried to impress on the pastors of his own Roman diocese the need for the "adaptation and rejuvenation of the forms of pastoral activity so that they may be adequate to modern pastoral needs."

He said that while the pastoral work of the parish always has its deposit of truth and grace, "it must perennially aim at the efficacy of its mission and, therefore, must continually renew itself. In the methods of its apostolate, studying how to conquer the wastage of custom, how to preserve what is good and beautiful in the venerable traditions of the past and how to revivify in hearts that which is ever-living in itself, the

Catholic Schools End Segregation

Belmont, N. C. — (RNS) — Belmont Abbey College and Sacred Heart Academy here have ended segregation. For the present, only Negro residents of Gaston County who are Roman Catholics will be admitted.

Caston County is the only county in North Carolina not included in the Diocese of Raleigh whose bishop, the Most Rev. Vincent S. Waters, recently asked that Catholic schools and hospitals under his jurisdiction admit Negro students and patients.

Tenth Anniversary Slated At Dominican Monastery

Devotions each evening during the Novena at 7:30, will consist of the Rosary, Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, special Novena prayers for all those making the Novena and their intentions; closing each evening with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

There will be a short talk each evening on the Apparitions of Our Blessed Lady since 1830 by the chaplain, Rev. Michael L. Hyman. The talks will stress Mary's unflinching attempts to bring our modern world back to God by prayer and penance as she emphasized at each Apparition.

THE SISTERS invite all to attend any or all of the Novena exercises, especially that on Rosary Sunday afternoon. They wish it to be a tribute of Thanksgiving to God for the hundred-fold blessings given them during the past ten years, also an outward expression of appreciation to all the friends of the diocese and particularly to their friends in Elmira.
