By Speaker At Seminary


One of the difficulties about dealing with communism in America is that many Americans do not understand that it is not a party, but a conspiracy. This William C. Kernan of Fordham University School of General Studies, declared in an address, "Communism in American Education," delivered on Sept. 26 to students of St. Bernard Semi-

The lecture was presented under the joint auspices of the Dante Society of the Seminary and the St. Bernard Alumni Association.

Kernan, formerly an Episcooal minister, was received into the Catholic Church in 1952. Previous to that he had been actively engaged, in the field of lecturing, radio and television, as a crusader for human rights. As a nember of the non-sectarian Scarsdale Citizens Committee, he has been, and continues to be, active in exposing communist infiltration in the public schools f Scarsdale.

QUOTATIONS FROM the leaders of Marxist communism, from Lenin and Stalin to William J Foster, show up clearly the Communist philosophy and the campaign based upon it, Mr. Kernan said, For the Communist, he explained, history is a constant truggle in which the lower classes rise against the upper classes and displace them by evolution.




