### "Missionary Work Needed Here" Says Mrs. Cahill

Corning — Decriing exploitation of migrant laborers brought from the southland to Steuben County's potato and bean fields, Mrs. Tom Cahill of Corning last week painted a sorrowful picture of conditions to be found in labor camps in the western part of the county.

At secretary of the area migrant committee, she was guest speaker at the monthly evening of the Catholic Action Society of St. Vincent de Paul Church. The affair was held in the parish hall. About 100 society members and their husbands attended the dinner-meeting presided over by Mrs. Helena Bonnell, president, and Mrs. Beth Crispino, vice president.

OPENING PRAYERS were led by the Rev. James Slattey. Mrs. Bonnell conducted the business session and introduced Mrs. Cahill, who, while speaking, appealed to the Society for donations of dishes and clothing for migrants in the area. Members were requested to contact Mrs. Dudley McLaughlin or Mrs. Robert McClure who will arrange for the articles to be delivered to Mrs. Cahill.

"As church workers, you women hear often of the missions and their dire needs abroad," Mrs. Cahill said, "but some missionary work is needed right here in our own backyards. Hundreds of men, women and children are living in abject poverty just a few miles away. Most of them can neither read nor write. Their children don't even attend schools.

"Dishes and cooking utensils are a luxury. The pay is low; injured workers often times go unattended; compensation is not for them."

BUT THEIR Angel and the eight brave Dominicans who arrived that day from the Buffalo Monastery saw the beauty of the gorgeous pines that surrounded the "vacant house," the stretches of velvet lawn that might spring up in the future and another stable in which their Eucharistic God would make His Home.

They saw a transformation—a dream to be fulfilled—they were not afraid—they looked up and saw Jesus and His Blessed Mother, smiling a warm welcome and beckoning them in and on to the Rosary Hill of tomorrow.

Watkins Glen — Plans are completed for a "Jimmy Franzese Memorial Dinner" to be held at the Padua High School of the Franciscan Fathers on Sunday, Oct. 10 at 7 p.m. Young Franzese, 24, coach of the Padua High School for the past two years, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Dominic Franzese of N. Madison Avenue, was fatally injured in a truck accident this past summer.

The Rev. Claude Zabinski, O.F.M., administrator, said yesterday: "It is our hope that we can perpetuate his memory here at the school and in the mission fields abroad. The money we raise on the dinner will become the James Franzese Memorial Fund. This fund will be turned over to the Rev. George Dubowski, O.F.M., the school's athletic director for the past five years.

Father George was Jimmy's immediate superior and they both worked very closely together in the athletic program of Padua. Father George is leaving the school for the island of Samar in the town of Calbayog in the Philippine Islands. It is the plan of the James Franzese Memorial Fund Committee to turn over all the proceeds of the dinner to Father George for use in his work in the islands."
