Indian School Being Rebuilt Despite Lack Of Funds

An earthquake, a flood, and the wear of 138 years have reduced all but the bell tower of the Palo Verde Indian mission buildings in California to a pile of adobe ruins.

Shortly after it was built in 1816 an earthquake-cracked the tower and the 1916 California flood washed it from its foundation.

The Verona Fathers, now in charge of the mission, decided this spring to establish a school for the Indians. "We had little money in the treasury," writes the Father superior to Father Cullen of the Marquette League (289 4th Ave., New York 10, N.Y.) "but we have great confidence in the Good Lord and so we began digging the foundation."

After their day's work, the Indians work on the school project, hauling lumber from Palo Verde Mountain and making adobe bricks. "It is hoped that if good friends of our American Indians will help the good padre to finish their work," he said.
