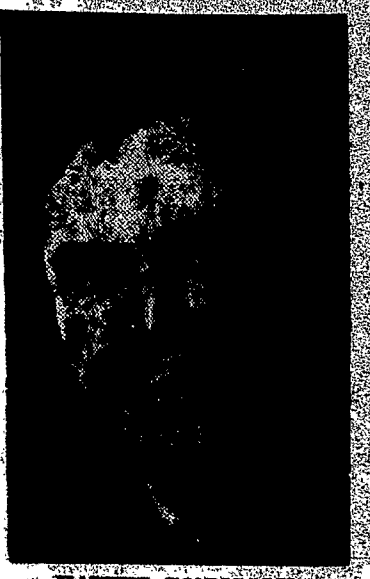

Ground Broken For New Pittsford Church, School

Ground was broken by His Excellency Bishop Kearney for a new church and an eight-room school to be built by St. Louis Parish, Pittsford, last Sunday afternoon. The Bishop said that the building will serve "for the honor of God and the souls of the little ones."

We have to let their minds expand, and they can't do that in a little room," he added. He called the building project "a beautiful and significant mission."

THE GENERAL campaign to raise funds for the project opened last night (Thursday), with a dinner at Oak Hill Country Club for the 80 workers. Bishop Kearney and the Rev. James R. Barnett, S.J., rector of McQuaid Jesuit High School spoke.

Since 1950, grammar school enrollment has increased from 68 to 250. The pupils now attend classes in the parish convent. The Rev. John A. Reddington, pastor, expects the enrollment to jump 10 to 15 percent yearly. The parish church was built in 1944. Its original capacity of 200 was expanded to 300 by remodeling, but Father Reddington has said that the average Sunday attendance now exceeds 1,000. Estimated cost of the project is \$450,000.

The Rev. Mr. Louis M. Edelman, pastor-emeritus, was present for the ground breaking ceremony.

Robert E. Ginna, executive vice president of the Rochester Gas and Electric Co., is general chairman, and Frank Ferick, publicity manager.

Monsignor Connaughton Rites Slated Monday

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. William J. Connaughton, a Dean of the Diocese of Rapid City, South Dakota and pastor of Sacred Heart Church, Burke, S. D., died Oct. 13, 1954 at Mother-of-

Grace Hospital, Gregory, S. D., where he has been a patient for some time.

FUNERAL SERVICES will be held at Immaculate Conception Church, Rochester on Monday, Oct. 18 at 10 a.m. His Excellency Bishop, William T. McCarthy, C.S.S.R., of Rapid City will be celebrant of the Mass and will preach the eulogy.

The body will lie in state after 4 p.m. Sunday. Rosary will be recited at 8:30 p.m. in the church.

Monsignor Connaughton's body was accompanied to Rochester by the Rev. Bernard A. Drew, pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church, Rapid City, and a native of Rochester.

Bearers will be the Reverend Fathers Donald Murphy, Charles V. Boyle, Gerald E. Dunn, George S. Wood, Frederick W. Bush and John E. Roach.

MONSIGNOR Connaughton was the son of the late Peter and Mary O'Hara Connaughton. His family were residents of the Immaculate Conception parish from the time of the founding of the parish. He is a graduate of the Immaculate Conception School and his studies for the priesthood were made at St. Andrew's Seminary, Rochester and the Seminary of Our Lady of the Snows, Montreal, Canada.

HE WAS ORDAINED in St. James Cathedral, Montreal, on December 15, 1912.

During his seminary training he realized the great need for priests in the Dakotas, and after ordination he volunteered his services to the late Most Rev. John J. Lawler, Bishop of Rapid City. He was assigned to the pastorate of Sacred Heart Church

Bishop Kearney Addresses Students At College Fair
