**Courage, Determination, Faith Needed: Msgr. Burns**

Approximately 200 persons at the annual Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus dinner heard the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Richard K. Burns, pastor of St. Thomas Church, remind them that courage, determination, and faith of Columbus are needed today "if the hope that he kindled is not to die."

HIS EXCELLENCY Bishop Kearney preached at a special 6 p.m. Mass at St. Joseph Church preceding the dinner. He urged the Knights to "be the apostles of faith to bring back a true sense of morality to America."

Msgr. Burns in his address at the Columbus Civic Center declared:

"With a maximum of faith and a minimum of technique, a bare sufficiency of equipment, superabundance of courage, Columbus opened a new world... In an era of cynicism when hope was almost dead, when the Turks had overtaken Greece and were about to cast their ugly shadow at the gates of Vienna, a whole new world opened up because of the courage and faith of one man."

Richard G. Thiele, principal of School 9, was toastmaster at the dinner. Past Grand Knight Joseph B. Rooney was committee chairman. Sgt. Leo V. Davis of the Rochester Police Bureau presented to Bishop Kearney in behalf of the K. of C. a \$1500 check for the Bishop's program. Guests were welcomed by Grand Knight Andrew E. Knauf. The Rev. Raymond Heisel, chaplain, delivered the invocation.
