

## Two Nazareth College Sisters Attend Meeting

Sister Rose Angela, dean of Nazareth College and Sister St. Catherine, director of studies are attending the 37th Annual Meeting of the American Council on Education in Chicago, which closes today. The meeting is being held at the Conrad Hilton Hotel.

The opening session was devoted principally to educational goals, content and practices in natural science, social science and the humanities, with particular reference to the demands which will be made on institutions of higher learning in the next ten years.

PLANS WERE discussed to meet the rapidly increasing number of students who will be seeking admission to colleges in the 1950's.

Odum, University of North Carolina, representing the social sciences; and Dr. Joel Hildebrand, University of California, representing the natural sciences.

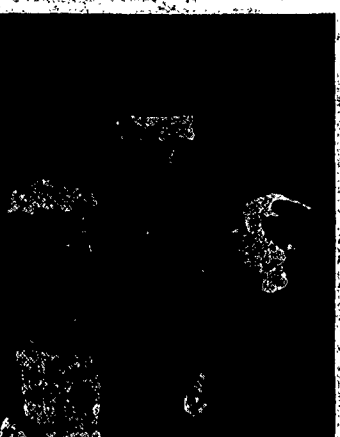
