 pattern, and are properly placed for a maximum of timely service.
 The adjacent lecture room for chemistry and physics with its elevations, its gray and gold walls and again its excellent standard fittings, is the eighth and final unit of the science department of the new St. Agnes High School. Planned for a student body of eight hundred girls, it has the necessary space and equipment for anticipated growth.
 The audio-visual room is also on the third floor. Besides all the classroom facilities it has a large storage room for equipment which can be easily transported to other classrooms by means of the nearby elevator.
 The convent comprises two stories and basement. An open corridor as well as an underground passage connects it with the school. On the first floor is the convent chapel placed as to be accessible to students through an inner cloister hall.
 The beautiful Poggio Imperiale marble altar which dominates the chapel was sculptured in Italy. In the large block is a mosaic of the Lamb in gold and liturgical red and blue. The mensa is of Botticino marble and the platform of Tosa colored Alicante. The hand carved wood reredos and crucifix complete and accent the beauty of the altar. The walls of the chapel are plaster with ceilings beamed in oak. In the sanctuary, panels of translucent glass fitted between the beams conceal the fluorescent lighting above them. The mul-
