St. Theodore Altar Society will hold its monthly meeting on Oct. 27.

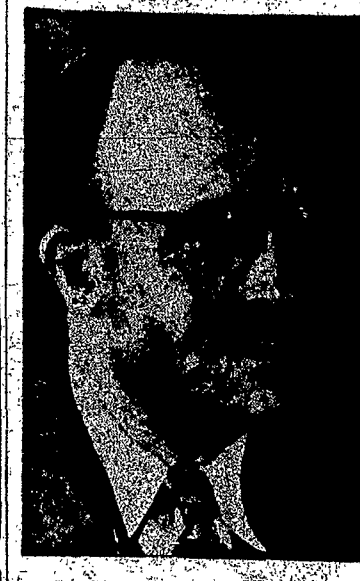
Rosary and Benediction will be said in the church at 8 p.m. and the business meeting will be held at the Town Hall on Buffalo Rd. at 8:30.

## Doctor Arnett To Address Medina Group

Dr. Ross H. Arnett, head of the department of biology at St. John Fisher College will address the Daughters of American Colonists of Medina, in his 1954-1955 series of travel lectures on the West Indies.

He will speak in Medina on Feb. 12. His lecture is illustrated with colored slides which Dr. Arnett has taken in these tropical islands. Dr. Arnett is recognized as an authority on the West Indies and an artist in the field of colored photography. He has traveled extensively throughout the West Indies and has lived for two years in Panama.

Dr. Arnett received his Ph.D. degree from Cornell University in 1945. During World War II he was section head of the Army School of Malaria at Fort Clayton, Panama Canal Zone, and later in charge of the sanitation and insect control at Avon Park Bombing Range, Fla.

He is a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, Ecological Society of America, American Society of Zoologists, Botanical Society of America, Society of Systematic Zoology and Albertus Magnus Guild.

He is the founder and publisher of the only publication in the world devoted entirely to the study of beetles, The Coleopterists' Bulletin.
