## Men Of 3 Area Eastern Rite Churches To Hear Father Englert At Closed Retreat

Catholic men of the Eastern Rite in three churches within the Diocese of Rochester area will attend a closed retreat at Notre Dame Retreat House, 246 Alexander St. on Nov. 26, 27 and 28, according to the Rev. Nicholas Wolensky, pastor of St. Joseph Church, Rochester.

Besides St. Joseph's men, it is expected retreatants will come from SS. Peter and Paul, Auburn and St. Nicholas, Elmira Heights.

The retreat will be conducted on the usual pattern of exercises from Friday evening until Sunday afternoon, under direction of the Redemptorist Fathers who staff the Retreat House.

Because the retreatants will be of the Byzantine Rite, the Rev. Clement C. Englert, C.S.S.R., will

come from New York to assist in the retreat. An authority in Eastern Rites, Father Englert will speak of their rite to the men and will celebrate Mass and evening service according to the Byzantine Rite.

A NATIVE of Rochester, Father Englert, now resides in New York City where he teaches at Fordham University. He is also spiritual director of the Ukrainian Catholic Seminary in Stamford, Conn.

By a special rescript of the Holy See, Father Englert has the rare privilege of being able to celebrate Holy Mass and administer the Sacraments not only in his own Roman Rite but also according to the Byzantine Rite.

He is the author of two best-selling booklets on the Eastern Rites, published by the Paulist
