### Father Beck To Speak To Newman Club

— The Rev. Henry G. J. Beck, noted lecturer and authority on Ecclesiastical History will speak on "The Thrill of Tradition" Sunday, Oct. 25 at 7:15 p.m. in the One World House of Angel Taylor Hall under the auspices of the Cornell Newman Club. FATHER BECK, who delivered a series of lectures last fall entitled "A Catholic Looks at the Reformation," is professor of Ecclesiastical History at the Immaculate Conception Seminary, Darlington, N.J. He is the fourth American to be awarded an honorary summa cum laude in his field from the Gregorian University in Rome. An author of several articles in the field of medieval history in various professional journals, Father Beck is a member of the Historical Association of Great Britain, the American Historical Association and the American Society of Church History.

### Indian Boys At Prayer Petition Blessed Mother

In this Little Boys' dormitory and in all the other dormitories of the St. Francis Mission in South Dakota for Sioux Indians, the children add to their "Good Night" prayers, a very special and urgent petition to Our Blessed Mother, to find them an adopted mother so that they may remain in school. Many reverses threaten the mission school's existence, which for many years has educated, fed, clothed and clothed some 500 Indian boys and girls.
