Baroness Cites German Risks In Rearmament

Rearmament of West Germany can endanger world peace, according to Baroness Elizabeth von Guttenberg, unless its Christianity is strengthened. Her advice, which came three days after West Germany had been granted sovereignty and the obligation to arm 12 divisions, was delivered to more than 600 persons at the opening session of the Thomas More Lecture Forum at the Chamber of Commerce Tuesday evening.

SHE CONTENDED that only through Christianity will West Germany resist the lure of renewed totalitarianism. She indicated that materialism in her homeland makes America's love of big cars seem pale.

West Germans are strongly anti-Communists, she explained, but they do not have a strong idea for which to stand. Materialism has grown to be a dominating force. And this is a danger. "It seems that our people spend all their time working and thinking about economic rebuilding," she continued. "What we need most of all is to re-educate our people toward a Christian feeling for the country. Few people really 'live their religion'."

IF CHRISTIANITY had not been so weak in Germany, she asserted, Hitler never would have come to power. At the outset the baroness explained her concern with West Germany's spiritual sterility. World War II, she said, cost her a husband, a son, and seven other relatives. All opposed Hitler and it was a cousin, she said, who planted the time bomb in the abortive attempt to assassinate the dictator.

Investiture Ceremony Set At Nazareth College

A tradition born at the University of Paris and Bologna eight centuries ago, will be carried out with a modern interpretation as the freshmen class of Nazareth College receives their caps and gowns from His Excellency Bishop Kearney on Nov. 4. The entire faculty lay and religious will be present.

The investiture ceremony marks the official acceptance of the new students into the college. HISTORICALLY, the traditional gowns came into use in the 12th century, at which time they were the common dress of the people. Later, details of the scholar's apparel were prescribed by university statutes to distinguish the different degrees of learning. The fashioning of the day—change, but the students kept their original styles to the present.

There are many rules and regulations regarding the wearing of the academic attire. At Nazareth the caps and gowns are in traditional black. Classes are differentiated by the color of the tassel and the position of it on the cap. The freshmen wear green tassels, sophomores red, juniors orange and seniors black.

During the investiture program, the freshmen class song will be sung publicly for the first time. Mary Therese Clark of Penn Yan is class chairman and Ann Ennis of Rochester is treasurer.
