East Rochester CYA To Open Membership Drive



Banquet Closes Week-long Double Jubilee Celebration

Week-long observance of the 50th anniversary of St. Joseph Commercial School and the 100th anniversary of the arrival of the School Sisters of Notre Dame to Rochester was concluded with an alumni banquet at the Hotel Seneca last Saturday.

His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey hailed the work of the school and the sisters in preparing its graduates for a spiritual as well as a temporal life. The bishop stated that the outstanding scholastic record of the school prepared its graduates not only to be good citizens and business men, but for eternity.

He paid special tribute to Sister Mary Ludolph, S.S.N.D., now retired, who taught at the school from 1910 to 1951. She earned the love and affection of many hundreds of pupils who attended the school during those years.

Bishop Casey suggested the formation of an alumni association to carry on the traditions of the school. It would be a means of renewing old friendships, he said.

The Rev. Gerald J. Whelan, C.S.S.R., rector of St. Joseph's, welcomed the alumni. Joseph L. Ernst, purchasing agent of the Rochester Board of Education and a member of the first graduating class at St. Joseph's, served as toastmaster, while Charles M. Bayer was general chairman for the observance.

Ceremony Set For Family Observance

Parishoners of Our Lady of the Victory Church will observe the Feast of Christ the King Sunday, Oct. 31, as one of the most festive family celebrations of the year.

Southern Province had offered Holy Mass in honor of the Holy Ghost in the main Chapel, to implore the blessings of God on the new project.

With the opening of the new school term in September 1955, the number of the Sisters, Brothers, Juniors, Novices, and Candidates will rise from the present number of 130 to a total of 215. The Students all board at the Seminary and, except for the Brother Candidates, the remainder live there all year round.

For the Major Seminary course the students will continue to go to St. Mary's Minor Seminary at Techry, Illinois. All are students and future Missionaries of the Society of the Divine Word which numbers now some 3590 Priests and Brothers throughout the world and are laboring in Foreign Missions on every continent and in the South Sea Islands.

The Society has one Cardinal, His Eminence Thomas Cardinal Ten SVD of Peking, China; 2 Arch Bishops; 24 Bishops. It has been active in educating Native Clergy in foreign mission lands, and conducts many diocesan Seminars in the Philippines and South America.

In the Southland of the U. S. the Divines are active in some 35 mission parishes. Recently the Society had ordained the 26th Negro priest belonging to the Society of the Divine Word. Originally founded in Steyl, Holland by Ven. Father Arnold Janssen, S.V.D., the Society will celebrate its Eightieth Anniversary in 1955.
