All messages must be in the USO office at least one week ahead of the delivery date. Messages filed early are sure of early delivery.

The USO club in Geneva is operated by the National Catholic Community Service, a member agency of the USO.

Most Neglected Mission Field Said Among Apaches

The Apache Reservation, recently reported Father Bonaventure, the Franciscan missionary stationed there, "is the most neglected pagan mission field in the world."

Among 3,500 inhabitants there are only 300 Catholics. Although there are two Catholic chapels on the 70,000 square mile reservation, there never has been any social activity or educational system. This spring Father Bonaventure, with some athletic equipment and a cash donation from the Marquette League, started a youth organization.

CATHOLIC missionaries have not only to combat the Apache's distrust of the white man but to compete with the enmeshment of non-Catholic denominations. The Lutherans maintain a well-served mission compound with a school and school buses, the Presbyterians and Methodists are also active. However, the largest number of the Apaches follow the Holy Ground, a Hopi-Aztec Snake religion.

Father Bonaventure believes that the social hall will greatly aid him in his missionary activities. He plans showing motion pictures there and now has a following of some 30 boys and girls. Darkening curtains for 12 windows at a cost of \$18 a window are needed and some \$300 for a paint job.

FATHER CULLEN of the Marquette League for Catholic Indian Missions (229 Fourth Ave., New York 10, N.Y.) hopes all friends of our American Indian missions will help in this much needed activity to aid a pagan field right within our own country.
