Christopher Lynch has been a favorite with American lovers of good music ever since his initial appearance on the "Voice of Firestone" radio program in 1944. He has become the tenor star of the Monday night musical program, as well as appearing as a guest on the Ed Sullivan, Dave Garroway and other television shows. He has conducted his own program, "The Christopher Lynch Show" over the Mutual network.  
Christopher Lynch is considered an authority on both Irish folklore and sports. Lynch was born in Rathkeale, County Limerick, on the banks of the River Deel. This area is noted as being the gathering place of the leprechauns, and "wee folk" who are as much a part of an Irishman's folklore as are shamrocks and peat bog.  
In sports, Christopher earned the title of "All-Ireland Champion Goalie" in the Irish national game of hurling, which is a second cousin of American hockey. He is six feet tall and is a husky 200 pounds, and is lovingly called by his Irish countrymen, "a brother" by his fans. He is a remarkably for the coveted sports title he won. He is an expert horseman.
