**Pontifical Mass, Dinner Mark St. Bridget's Jubilee**

Bishop Walter A. Foery of Syracuse returned to Rochester as principal speaker at the centennial dinner of St. Bridget's Church, Rochester held at Bausch and Lomb Auditorium, Wednesday night, where he met some of his former classmates.

The Centennial was formerly opened with Solemn Pontifical Mass on Sunday in St. Bridget's Church. His Excellency Bishop Kearney celebrated the Mass. In his sermon he likened the church to a natural mother and explained how the parish church nourished and reared children of the parish spiritually, with all the fervor of their own mothers, down through a century.

Bishop Foery, an alumnus of St. Bridget's School, said "We look upon the old shrine of St. Bridget's as a church saturated with the prayers of generations." He was a former altar boy in that church.

MUCH OF HIS talk to an audience of more than 1,100 persons was devoted to recalling events of the early 1900s when he attended St. Bridget's School, to which he paid high tribute.

The Rev. Gerald T. Brennan, who took over the parish at the height of the depression in the 1930s and is its 15th pastor, was

alluded to by Bishop Foery as "a great priest, who has carried on and will continue to carry on the great religious traditions which have surrounded St. Bridget's."

FATHER BRENNAN and Carl S. Hallauer, executive vice president of the Bausch & Lomb Optical Co. were the only other speakers introduced by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John M. Duffy, who was toastmaster. Also seated at the speaker's table was Joseph F. Taylor, president of Bausch & Lomb.

"We take our hats off to the past, we take our coats off to the future," observed Father Brennan as he concluded a brief talk on the centennial of the church, located at 45 Gotham St. Father Brennan had spent 15 months in preparing for the centennial, and last night's dinner program attested to the fact that nearly \$17,000 had been contributed to the centennial fund by parishioners, former parishioners and friends.
