

### Picpus Fathers Announce Transfer Of City Priest

Word was received this week of changes in assignments made by The Very Rev. William Condon, S.S.C.C., provincial of the United States Province of the Society of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. These have been brought about by the expansion of the scope of the Order's activities in the Western Hemisphere.

The Rev. Aloysius Dillon, S.S.C.C., for the past two and a half years vicar of Our Lady of Victory Church, Rochester, has been reassigned to Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Laverne, Calif.

Father Aloysius in his new assignment as pastor, will be establishing a new parish on the West Coast, which will mark the first venture of the Fathers of the Sacred Hearts into the Western part of the country. Plans call for the erection of a church structure, rectory, convent and elementary school at the new site. While in Rochester, Father Aloysius worked diligently as curate of "The Little French Church," and much of the resurgence of growth in the


parish has been due to his untiring efforts.

**ASSIGNED TO Our Lady of Victory** is Rev. Raymond Mahony, S.S.C.C. Father Raymond will be returning to Our Lady of Victory to serve as curate, a position which he held in 1951-52. Father Raymond is at present serving "Summer Churches" on Cape Cod.

Rev. Edward P. Cahens, S.S.C.C., pastor of Our Lady of Victory, also announced that Rev. Kevin O'Brien, S.S.C.C., has been assigned to the French Church as curate for an indefinite period. Father Kevin, former Novice Master at the Order's Major House in Fairhaven, Mass., will be assigned to the Mission Band. Father Joachim, a native of Rochester, has been serving as curate at St. Matthew's Parish, Mt. Gill at St. Matthew's Parish, Mt. Gill, Ohio. His new assignment will be for an indefinite period and will take him on preaching missions throughout the North East.

All new assignments will become effective at the end of this week.
