

**Physics Prof Turns Artist
To Ready Tragedy 'Oedipus'**

A trip to Stratford, Ont. started the theatrical ball rolling this summer for the Rev. Adolero L. Houde, C.S.B., head of the department of physics at St. John Fisher College, Rochester.
At the Shakespearean Theatre in Canada, he saw Tyrone Guthrie's much publicized production of Sophocles' "Oedipus Rex" with James Mason, English star of stage and screen, in the title role.
Completely "taken" by the presentation, Father Houde returned to Rochester with dreams of directing "Oedipus." The classic tragedy of the ill-fated king seemed ideal for college-level work, and certainly a challenge to the "Roff Guild", St. John Fisher dramatic group.
It promised something new to the men at Fisher, who so far boast a repertory of 19th century comedy, modern tragedy and old-fashioned melodrama in a two-year theatre career.
This fall, "Oedipus Rex" is scheduled for Friday and Saturday, Dec. 3 and 4, at the St. John Fisher presentation, will take place in the newly completed auditorium on East Ave.
FATHER HOUDE has taken advantage of his Stratford trek to copy the pure-classic style of the Canadian production, but one of the most outstanding innovations for a modern audience will be seeing the actors in masks.
This project alone is one that would make many production managers tremble, directors tear their hair and actors lose hope. A method almost completely for-
