**National Safety Day Effort
 Receives Area Support**

The Safety Education Division of the Rochester Police Bureau will join with every major traffic safety organization in the county, at the request of President Eisenhower's Action Committee for Safety, in an all out effort to go through a 24 hour period free of accidents on Wednesday, Dec. 15.

Purpose of "S.D." day is to show that motorists and pedestrians can eliminate traffic accidents by care in their own actions. According to the Rochester committee, "S.D. day will demonstrate that the place to attack the traffic safety problem is in the community, and that the responsibility rests on each individual citizen. It will implant in the minds of all motorists and pedestrians the realization that if they can reduce accidents on S.D. day, they can do so every day of the year."

LAST YEAR, one person in the United States was killed on the average of every 1 1/2 minutes. The total 1953 death toll was 38,300.

Police records also show that in 1953 there was an injury in traffic every 24 seconds. A total of 1,350,000 persons were injured to the point of disability. In every family of one or more persons were totally or permanently disabled, thereby becoming a financial burden either to his family or the community or both.

EVERY MOTORIST and pedestrian is urged on "S.D." day to accept full personal responsibility for complete adherence to the following basic safety principles: (1) observe the letter and the spirit of all traffic regulations; (2) be courteous to every driver and pedestrian, practice sportsmanship and give full attention to driving and walking. "In short, drive and walk as you would have every one else drive and walk."
