Travancore, India (NC) — The life of Sister Alphonsa, a Christ nun whose cause for beatification is being studied by the Holy See, will be filmed by a Spanish company, it was learned here.

The Indian nun, to whom many cures have been ascribed, died in the village of Bharananganam in 1946 at the age of 36. Most of her religious life was spent as an invalid.

Her tomb at the village church, which has been the object of pilgrimage since her death, her residence in a nearby village and the articles she used in her life will be utilized in the film, it was reported.

The cause for Sister Alphonsa's beatification was initiated in 1951 at the request of the Holy See.
