Doctor Mizener To Lecture On Shakespeare

Montour Falls — As part of the annual "Shakespearean Festival" at St. John Atonement Seminary, Montour Falls, Dr. Arthur Moore Mizener of Cornell University will give a lecture on "Shakespeare" at 7:30 p.m. on Dec. 12.

The lecture will be conducted in the Seminary gymnasium and is open to the public free of charge.

Dr. Mizener is at present professor of English at Cornell. Having received his B.S. degree with highest honors from Princeton University, Dr. Mizener was elected to his M.A. in 1932. He has returned to Princeton and received his doctorate in 1934.

Dr. Mizener has taught English at Yale (1934-1940), Wells College, Mass. (1944-1951). At Cornell (1940-1944) and Carleton College, Minn. (1944-1951), he has been a contributor of numerous articles to such professional journals as the Southern, Sewanee, and Kenyon Reviews. He was the co-winner of the Kenyon Review Short-Story Prize in 1946 and is the author of "The Far Side of Paradise: A Biography of F. Scott Fitzgerald" (1951). Dr. Mizener is listed in Who's Who.

Agency Pledges Sale Of O.K'd Comics

Youngstown, O. (NC) — The Mahoning Valley Distributing Agency has pledged to sell only those comics bearing the new seal of approval issued by the Murphy Code authority.

The pledge was made by Bernard Bloch of the agency, Mr. Bloch's attorney, Oscar Kaufman; city law director Felix Mika, and Police Chief Paul Cress, witnessed the pledge taking.

Mr. Bloch asked for police help in combating bootleggers who peddle the same vicious material which have been the target of criticism. He said known bootleg operators who have millions of copies stored with second hand and old titles are forcing them on the public through small stores.

THE BOOKS, he explained, are obtained from waste paper merchants after they had been removed from stands and scrapped to avoid the expense of returning them to the publishers.

City law director Mika warned that retailers who secure comic books through other than local sources should screen them and make sure they conform to city ordinance.

Safe Driving Day

By proclamation of President Eisenhower, acting on the recommendation of the President's Action Committee for Traffic Safety, Wednesday, December 15, will be designated nationally as "S-D Day" (Safe Driving Day).

In a dramatic attempt to illustrate the effect that concerted action can have on traffic accidents, every community in the nation will try to remain completely free of traffic accidents for 24 hours.

"Think of it! A whole day without a single traffic accident anywhere in the nation. Is it a fantastic dream? Maybe, but it's a beautiful thought. If it can become a reality, on that one day we will save at least 103 lives and prevent 3768 people from being injured in traffic. In 1953, the average toll of the road was one death every 14 minutes, an injury every 23 seconds.

It can be done, but it calls for the greatest cooperative job ever undertaken in behalf of accident prevention. National state and local S-D Day directors are enlisting the aid of all major traffic safety organizations. In the Rochester area, the Department of Public Safety, the Sheriff's Office, Board of Education, the Rochester Safety Council, the Junior Chamber of Commerce, industry and insurance groups have joined in a cooperative program of intensive education to alert every individual to this exciting challenge.

YOU CAN HELP. The ultimate success of this 24-hour demonstration will be determined by individual response. You can help by using every means at your command to publicize S-D Day and its purpose. Secondly, by accepting your full responsibility for complete adherence to these safety principles:

1. Observe the letter and the spirit of all traffic regulations.
2. Be courteous to every driver and pedestrian — practice sportsmanship.
3. Give full attention to driving and walking.

In short, drive and walk as you would have everyone else drive and walk.
