# Open House In Hornell Attracts 750 To School

Hornell—St. Ann School in Hornell held its annual open house last week with the Marian Year as the central theme of the displays. Classrooms were visited by more than 750 persons including 458 parents.

Each room featured displays depicting various phases of devotion to the Blessed Virgin. Shrinings, paintings and posters by the children were displayed in the rooms. Samples of the children's academic work were also on display.

The Sisters of Mercy, who comprise the faculty, discussed classroom procedures with parents and friends.

Every room had its own Christmas exhibit, centered by the Nativity scene.

AMONG THE classroom exhibits was the eighth grade's large colored-chalk mural illustrating the first reading of the Declaration of Independence; huge maps showing the economic and physical features of the different regions in the United States, drawn by the sixth graders; and posters on books read this year with original reviews written by the students to stimulate interest in outside reading.

In the fifth grade a large mural showed apparitions of the Blessed Virgin to St. Catherine Labouré; to St. Bernadette at Lourdes; and to the peasant children at Fatima.

In the fourth grade, written expression was motivated by each pupil's assembly of a "Just Me" album. Each booklet contained pictures of the youngster from infancy to the present. The children collected the pictures themselves and wrote an original caption under each of the photos.

A three-dimensional Indian village was made by the third graders. Aspects of Indian life were made more realistic by paper tepees, hand-stitched canoes, sponge evergreen trees and twig trees.

ON THE FACULTY are Sister M. Succursu, principal, fourth grade; Sister M. Ursula, eighth grade; Sister M. Brendan, seventh grade; Sister M. Paul, sixth grade; Sister M. Lawrence, fifth grade; Sister M. Germaine, third grade; Sister M. Consilia and Sister M. Angela, second grades; Sister M. Annunziata, first grade, and Mrs. Edward Deigan, kindergarten. Sister M. Raymond Joseph heads the music department.

In the Pledge Room, the Mothers' Club conducted an annual bazaar. Mrs. Raymond Moretti was chairman and Mrs. Dennis Drew was co-chairman. Mrs. Michael Horvat was treasurer.
