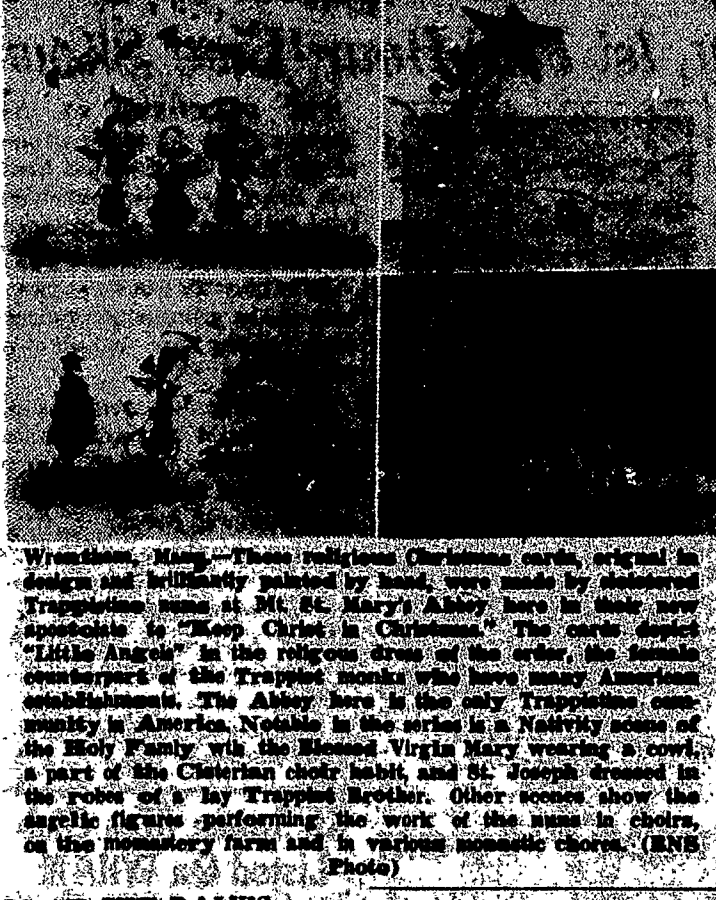

**WAYS OF PEACE**

In the excerpts from Bishop Wright's address which I am quoting today we find some striking matter.  
After having stated that Catholic peace is found where there is "climate of peace arising from the very soil of the towns and cities," the speaker continued:  
"That brings us next to knowing that the concept of peace that this climate of peace has is not necessarily one with dominant characteristics of his prosperity or material well-being. Some of us have more means now than when we were poor — and some of us have secured increased possessions to worry about."  
And thus, on the individual level again, we are carried over into the organized social community, the organized social community.  
"THAT IS THE reason why we Americans must at all costs resist any efforts by anyone to sell us the idea that the concept of peace involves the guarantee of what is called in a very fancy phrase sometimes, 'The American Way of Life.' For the American Way of Life may not be, in every respect, God's way. It may not in every respect be a peaceful way. It may not in every respect deserve peace."  
The essential question is how well human values will survive. And we could ask that of the American way in that form. For the American way is featuring here a very soft way. To be sure, it leaves us fundamentally free for the Christian lives, but there are many aspects of the industrial and the business civilization which makes it difficult to lead Christian lives, even though you are free to do so yourselves.  
"OUR LIBERTY, therefore, is incomplete, and in some ways it is dangerously incomplete limited thing; where color is concerned, it is dangerously limited, and also in the matter of certain aspects of civil corruption. But still it does include liberty. But it can be very cynical."  
We American Catholics, particularly those with certain national backgrounds, have a great
