

**Rites Conducted For J. F. Warner**

Funeral services for John Frederick Warner, 48, conducted by His Excellency Auxiliary Bishop Casey at Thomas Funeral Chapel, 4545 Lake Ave. Mr. Warner of 81 Sheppard St. Rochester died unexpectedly on Sunday, Dec. 5, 1954.

The Requiem High Mass was celebrated in Holy Cross Church by the Rev. William L. Reed. Also in the sanctuary were the Rev. Daniel Hogan and the Rev. Elmer Van Heine, whose father was a life-long friend of Mr. Warner.

Bearers were Elmer Dochak, Alton Franch, Burt Clair, John Shapley, Robert Taylor and Wesley Woodson.

Son of the late Charles Warner and Mary Fanning, Mr. Warner was born in Oswego, Aug. 22, 1886. He was educated in Rochester at St. Mary's School, East High School, University of Rochester and Queen's University, Toronto.

His final assignment was in the electrical construction department of the Rochester Gas and Electric Corp. Later he was self-employed and his last assignment was with Stromberg-Carlson Co. He retired more than five years ago.

For some years Mr. Warner had suffered from a heart condition. He had had two coronary occlusions previous to his third attack on Sunday while driving to Mass. He pulled over to the side of the street. Falmers by passing his condition notified Holy Cross Church from which Father Reed was requested to administer the Last Rites of the Church.

Mr. Warner is survived by a sister, Miss Marion R. Warner, 6455 S. Mrs. Lillian Alberto; an aunt, Mrs. Agnes Kelly of Ithaca; and an uncle, John Fanning of Oswego.

He was a member of the Men's Club of Holy Cross Church; member of which was on Dec. 8 and member of the Rosary led by the Rev. Louis J. Hohmann.

Services at the grave in Holy Sepulcher Cemetery were conducted by the Rev. J. Joseph O'Connell, pastor of Holy Cross Church.



**'Bamboo Prison' Film Hit By Ithaca Rosary Group**

Ithaca — The Rosary and Altar Society of Immaculate Conception Church, Ithaca, held their Christmas Party in the Parish Hall Monday evening following recitation of the Rosary and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in Church.

Mrs. Alice Sullivan presided and the women unanimously agreed and signed a petition which will be sent to Columbia Pictures in Hollywood, protesting a film entitled "Bamboo Prison" which is scheduled for release soon.

This picture distorts events in the life of Father Emil Kapaun, a Catholic Chaplain of the Korean War who heroically gave his life and has been three times honored by our government. In the picture the Chaplain turns out to be a traitor and a Communist spy.

This distortion is a reflection on Chaplains of all faiths and an insult to American G.I.'s everywhere who consider the Chaplains of the Army an integral part of their life in service. It is hoped that if enough righteous people protest to Columbia Pictures the picture will never be released.
