Mr. Madigan, a mechanic with the subway division of the Rochester Transit Corp. for more than 40 years, died unexpectedly Dec. 14, 1954, at the age of 59. His home was at 1117 1/2 1/2 St. in Rochester.

Requiem Mass Set Today For Father McLaughlin

A Solemn Requiem Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. today (Dec. 23) in Precious Blood Church, Detroit, for the Rev. John R. McLaughlin, C.S.B., a former Latin teacher at Aquinas Institute, who died unexpectedly Dec. 20, 1954 in the residence of the Basilian Fathers of Catholic Central High School, Detroit, Mich. He was 38 years old.

Father McLaughlin left Aquinas a year ago last September to join the faculty of Catholic Central High School in Detroit. He was stricken with what appeared to be a heart attack as he was going to dinner in the residence about 6 p.m. He died there at 9:30 and a half later.

FATHER McLAUGHLIN, a native of Cornwall, Ontario, Canada was educated in St. Michael College School in Toronto. After spending a year at St. Basil Novitiate he was professed on Sept. 12, 1936. He then attended St. Michael College of the University of Toronto, the University of Detroit and St. Basil Seminary of Toronto.

Fourth Texas Mission Church Financed By Aquinas Mission Fund

Two Aquinas students, David Bertich and Gerard Frank, will be present at the dedication of a new St. Basil Mission Church at Eagle Lake, Texas on Sunday, Jan. 3. This church, costing \$12,000 was financed by the Aquinas Mission Crusade and will be dedicated by His Excellency Bishop Noid, of Galveston.

The new church is a typical southern mission church. Besides church space it consists of a class room, a meeting room and a bedroom for the attendant missionary. The money to build the church was supplied by the Aquinas students and the construction work was done by the Mexicans under the supervision of the Missionaries.

The new church is part of a new project being undertaken by the Basilian Missionaries for the Mexican people along the Gulf Coast of Texas. A non-profit corporation has been set up by Texas laymen. This corporation purchased 12 acres of land at Eagle Lake and this has been laid out in lots with streets, etc., with the Church in the center. It is called Guadalupe Terrace.

THE PURPOSE of the corporation is to help the poor Mexican people along the Gulf Coast of Texas. They will be able to build a five room house with all utilities for about \$3,000. There will be no down payments or interest. Each family will pay \$25 per month and in ten years' time will get a deed for the house and land.

The Eagle Lake Church is the fourth project financed by the Aquinas Mission Crusade on the Mexican Missions. In 1949 a Chapel costing \$3,000 was erected.

THE AREA has grown in population but it is a backward area. Non-Catholic Missionaries have built several churches in this area and have established a free kindergarten. The new church at Bay City will include a kindergarten for the Mexican children.
