Dedication Of Lives To Mary Urged By Bp. Kearney At Holy Name Mass

His Excellency Bishop Kearney called upon 600 men who attended the annual Holy Name Society Mass Sunday in St. Joseph Church, Rochester, to dedicate their lives to the service of Mary, the Queen of Heaven.

As a public tribute on the part of the Holy Name men present, the Bishop crowned the Blessed Virgin's statue in a ceremony preceding the Mass at 11:30 a.m. John M. Hedges, president of the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union, presented the crown in behalf of the Holy Name men to Bishop Kearney who then performed the coronation rite.

The Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, diocesan spiritual director, celebrated the Mass. Assisting were the Rev. Edward Zimmer, chaplain of the Rochester Firemen's Holy Name Society, as deacon, and the Rev. Henry Atwell, assistant editor of the Catholic Courier-Journal, as subdeacon.

Rt. Rev. Msgr. John E. Maney, chancellor of the diocese, was assistant priest to the Bishop. Chaplains to the Bishop were the Very Rev. Msgr. Gerald C. Lambert, pastor of St. Monica Church, and Very Rev. Msgr. John S. Randall, chaplain of the Rochester Police Holy Name Society.

The Rev. John L. Connan was master of ceremonies to the Bishop. Minor officers of the Mass were students at St. Bernard Seminary.

Uniformed delegations of police and fire bureau Holy Name Societies and men from the postal employees group attended.

In his sermon following the Mass, Bishop Kearney said that Christ and His Mother are inseparably associated wherever the true Christian Faith is found.

The attempt of the Reformers to separate Mary from her Divine Son resulted only in the breakdown of morality and the loss of the purity of Christian Faith, he continued.

The modern rejection of Chris-

tian morality in the family has followed in the wake of the Reformers' rejection of Christ's Mother from her honored position in the Christian tradition, he said.

Recalling that Herod was the first one to attempt to separate Christ from His Mother, the Bishop warned that "all attempts to separate the Mother and Son are doomed to the same failure which Herod suffered two thousand years ago."

The Bishop likened the Holy Name men to the Christian knights who dedicated their lives

to the complete service of their Queen. "You, too," he said, "are modern Knights of Our Lady, The Blessed Virgin, your Queen whom you serve by leading pure lives, by the sincere practice of your Faith and giving good example."

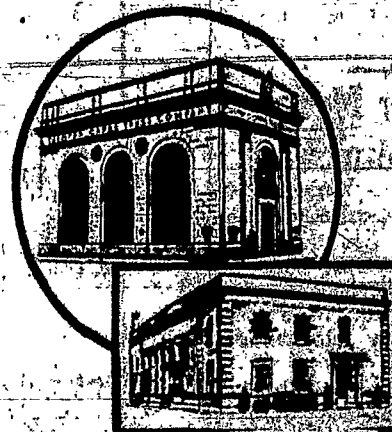
