Altar rails in churches throughout the Diocese of Rochester were crowded especially at early Masses on the Feast of the Holy Family as the faithful carried out the custom of receiving Holy Communion together as suggested by His Excellency Bishop Kearney.

Families, large and small in number, and those with small children who have just received their first Holy Communion up to those of greater age, moved silently to the communion rail in a sight edifying to all who attended. The attendance seemed to be greater this year, although no estimate was immediately available.

The parents and children were responding to the Bishop's letter urging participation in the practice and keeping in mind his words:

"Nothing will bring the blessing of the Holy Family upon our own homes so generously as this tribute to the Holy Family of Bethlehem."

Sermons in the various churches centered around the thought of the ideal Christian family and in means to emulate such a family.

The practice of taking the mother of the family out to breakfast was again carried out. Hotels and restaurants in downtown Rochester were busy throughout the morning.

The Parents Group of Blessed Sacrament Parish of which the Rev. Edwin R. Wedow is chaplain sponsored a breakfast in the Culver Road Armory. Three hundred and fifty persons were reported attending by Chairman, Mr. and Mrs. James Connolly.

Similar breakfasts were sponsored by the parish Holy Name Societies in St. Charles Borromeo Parish, Greece and Immaculate Conception, Ithaca. At St. Charles a total of 761 persons were served, 25 percent more than last year. Another group breakfast was served at Mother of Sorrows Church, Greece.
