



Rochester's 38th automobile show will be staged at the East Main Street Armory in Rochester Jan. 29 through Feb. 5, under the auspices of the Rochester Automobile Dealers Association, Inc.

The show will run continuously from 1 p.m. to 10:45 p.m. daily including Sunday.

ON DISPLAY will be all of the 1955 makes of American cars, Buick, Cadillac, Chevrolet, Chrysler, DeSoto, Dodge, Ford, Hudson, Imperial, Kaiser, Lincoln, Mercury, Nash, Oldsmobile, Packard, Plymouth, Pontiac, Studebaker and Willys. Among the foreign sports cars on display will be Austin-Healey, Jaguar, MG, Volkswagen and Hudson Italia.

Also there will be numerous experimental models, cutaway models, accessories, banking displays and safety exhibits.

Throughout the show period all colorcasts on both the NBC and CBS network will be carried. Plenty of parking will be provided immediately adjacent to the Armory and in the vicinity.
