Mrs. Katherine C. Lynch, president of the Board of Directors of St. Christopher's Library, extended a cordial invitation to all. New books available are:

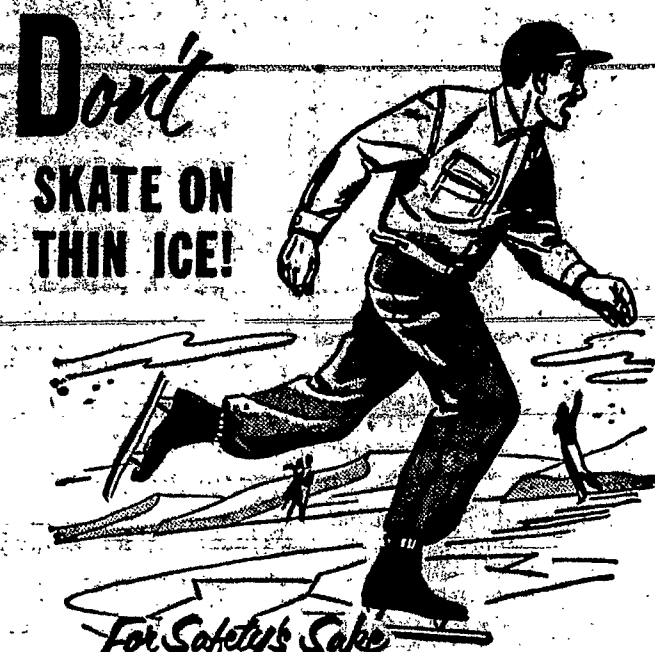

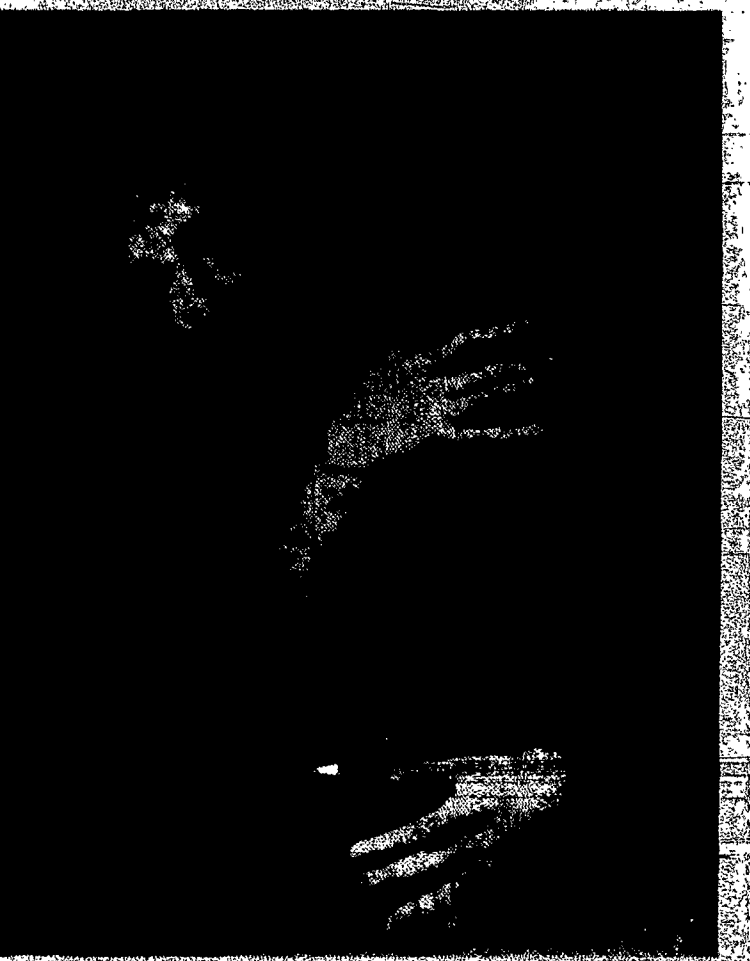
