Professor Karl Cerny Talks At Georgetown Club Meeting

"While the antagonism between Communism and the rest of the world is fundamentally an antagonism between atheism and belief, practically speaking, the conflict is, and must necessarily be, in terms of a large number of concrete problems."

So Professor Karl H. Cerny of Georgetown University Graduate School stated in a talk to the Georgetown Club of Rochester, on Feb. 17. The dinner meeting of the Club, attended by vicinity alumni and their wives, took place in the University Club.

PROFESSOR CERNY'S general subject was "Eisenhower's Foreign Policy." He reviewed first of all the "policy of containment" which had been adopted by our government under President Truman, with regard to the Iron Curtain countries; a policy of fighting the cold war and engaging even in small actual warfare, in the hope that Communism might be forced to enter international discussions and make concessions.

The speaker examined the course taken by the Eisenhower administration. He pointed out the new directions which the President has taken: development, encouragement of defense alliances, especially in the mid-eastern and psychological warfare; and, far east; promises of freer trade and the sharing of atomic knowledge for peaceful uses.

Nevertheless, the Professor declared, the Eisenhower administration has, in general, continued the foreign policy of the Truman administration, although it originally gave indications that it hoped to reverse that policy.

THE PRESENT administration has enjoyed certain diplomatic successes. In other respects, partly because of the pressure of other Allied governments, it has ceded ground. The speaker expressed his personal fear that the increased caution of the administration during the past few months might become excessive, and result in a reluctant but complete acceptance of the division of the world into free and Communist spheres.

The Rev. Robert F. McNamara, president of the Georgetown Club of Rochester, presided.
