Ordained In Prison Camp Now Teaches Natives

Ordained in a prison camp in Japan in 1914, Father Douc recently started a "Training Center for Religion Teachers" with small donations from various sources. Recently Our Lady of Mercy High School Mission group received a note of thanks for sending the sum of \$200.

Father Douc states that another \$1,000 is needed before the second floor can be completed.

'Every Knight Is A Foster Father' Bishop Asserts

Every Knight of Columbus is a "foster father in a real sense" and is adding by his membership in forming character among youth, His Excellency Bishop Kearney told 800 K. of C. members and their sons at Mass on Sunday, March 6 in St. Joseph Church, Rochester.

The Bishop celebrated the Mass which preceded a Communion Breakfast in Columbus Civic Center at which John T. Nothnagle of the K. of C. Speakers Bureau addressed the fathers and sons.

THE VOCATION of St. Joseph is similar to that of any father, the Bishop said and it was appropriate that fathers and sons receive Holy Communion together in March, the month of vocations and St. Joseph's Feast.

Catholic education and recreational facilities fostered by the organization in the state and elsewhere are contributing to a right character formation the Bishop said. He cited the millions of dollars contributed by the Catholic church to teaching a right philosophy to youth from the kindergarten to university.

If this country, the Bishop declared, could work out a plan whereby each child would get a religious training, the rate of juvenile delinquency would go down. "As long as the government by means of process of education goes on, little can be done about delinquency," he said.

MANY CHILDREN are being brought up with no fear of teachers, police nor judges. Young people are not told of the Ten Commandments.

Christian philosophy of education is built entirely upon the law of God, the Bishop said and it is this philosophy that must be taught the young. "If we do not have discipline we shall reap the results," among growing children, the Bishop declared.

Nothnagle in his talk at the breakfast explained how good example in the home will tend to avert delinquency tendencies. The prominent real estate man deplored opposition given to foundation of a Catholic church and school in Brighton.

Aside from the religious influence of a foundation could have on delinquency in the community, Nothnagle said he had never heard of a church or school deteriorating property values. On the contrary, he said, in most instances the real estate values have risen.


The concert is one of the events marking the Centenary of the Sacred Heart Convent. Sponsoring the presentation are members of the Academy's Alumnae Association.
