The most talked about fight in the '55 finals seems to be the middleweight contest between football hero Hank Angelone and Dick Tierney. Angelone, a senior, took the championship of his division when he was a freshman and held it until last year when he met Tierney in the finals.

IN THESE FINALS, Tierney, a boy who made a great comeback from being defeated the champ much to the surprise of all the spectators. Both boys are training hard for this fight, but they are each giving it their all, for different reasons.

Angelone must win this year to avenge the only blot on his great athletic career at Aquinas and Tierney must win to prove to all that it was not just by luck that he won last year. This fight promises to be one of the better middleweight contests to be staged in the Sports Arena in a long time.

Besides Tierney, there are two other champs defending their crowns in these finals. Dave Hogan, twice a finalist, will defend his crown and dynamite Dick Corbett a two time champ, will put his bantamweight title on the line.

Tickets are \$2 for ringside; \$1.50 for reserved and \$1 for unreserved. The Sports Arena is almost sold out, but a few tickets are still available from members of the Aquinas Mission Bout Boosters Club.

All the profits of this famous sporting event will go to the home and foreign missions. Last year they realized over \$10,000 for this worthy cause.

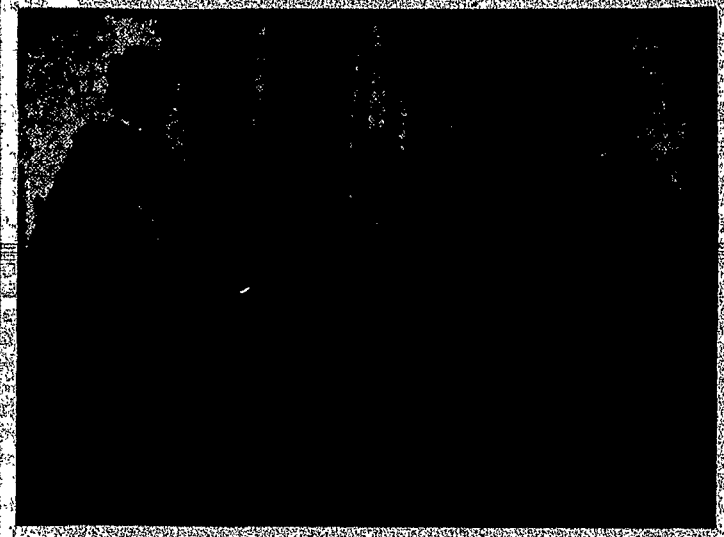
St. Monica HN Men Schedule Breakfast

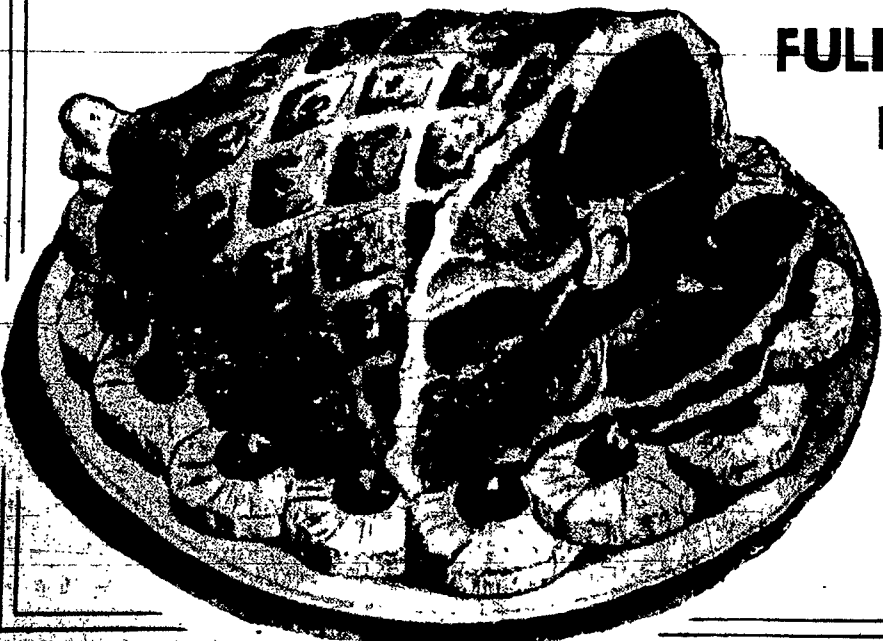
